

**RESOLUTION NO. 22-\_\_\_\_\_**

**A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ACCEPTING THE PRELIMINARY AND FINAL PLAT WITH CONSTRUCTION PLANS FOR TRADITION REGIONAL PARK, WITHIN THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE, FLORIDA, ON THE REQUEST OF KIMLEY-HORN AND ASSOCIATES (P21-250); PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

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**WHEREAS**, the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida has been requested by Kimley Horn and Associates, acting as agent for the City of Port St. Lucie and Mattamy Palm Beach, LLC, to approve a preliminary and final plat with construction plans for Tradition Regional Park, within the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, there are public/private improvements, i.e., roads, drainage, and utility facilities, to be constructed within the platted area; and

**WHEREAS**, a performance guarantee covering the cost of the improvements has been submitted to the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the plat conforms to Section 156, Port St. Lucie City Code, and meets all State requirements for such plats; and

**WHEREAS**, the Site Plan Review Committee, on November 10, 2021, recommended approval of the preliminary and final plat with construction plans (P21-250).

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE, FLORIDA:**

Section 1.     Ratification of Recitals.     The foregoing recitals are hereby ratified and confirmed as true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Resolution.

Section 2.     That the City Council hereby approves the preliminary and final subdivision plat with construction plans for Tradition Regional Park (P21-250), within the City of Port St.

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Lucie, Florida, said final plat and construction plans being offered by the City of Port St. Lucie and Mattamy Palm Beach, LLC, as owners and title holders of said property, and as prepared by Ronnie L. Furniss of Caulfield and Wheeler Inc., as designated on the attached Plat.

Section 3. Conflicts. If any Resolution, or parts of any Resolution, are in conflict herewith, this Resolution shall control to the extent of the conflicting provisions.

Section 4. Severability. The provisions of this Resolution are intended to be severable. If any part of this Resolution is determined to be void or is declared illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Resolution shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
