Strategic Plan Link: The City's Goal to enjoy culture, nature and fun activities.

Executive Summary (General Business): Proposed by artist J. Carvallo, the installation is conceived as a walk-through sculptural experience designed to activate and enrich the public realm at Greco Park. Strategically positioned to align with the existing ramp, the piece will guide visitors seamlessly from the street level up into the plaza, acting as both a landmark and an invitation into the space. From the street, the installation will also serve as a striking visual marker, enhancing the identity of the property. The complete work will be comprised of three individual sculptures, each positioned to create a dynamic array. Collectively, they establish a rhythm that complements pedestrian circulation and encourages engagement.

- Dimensions (each piece): approximately 9' L × 7' W × 10' H
- Composition: fabricated from aluminum rectangular tubing, finished with metallic dual-gradient color treatments inspired by kinetic and optical art masters.
- Design Intent: the forms evoke the progression of a parallelogram in motion, symbolizing transformation and energy.

Each of the three pieces is rotated uniquely, suggesting evolution and continuity within the series. The sculptures are interactive by design. Beyond serving as visual art, they invite the public to approach, touch, and move among them- blurring the line between artwork and environment. This tactile quality creates a participatory experience, reinforcing the park's role as a civic gathering space.

By integrating art, architecture, and landscape, this installation will transform the entry sequence into Greco Park into an immersive, memorable, and inclusive cultural experience.

Presentation Information: The applicant and/or artist will provide a presentation.

Staff Recommendation: The Planning and Zoning Department recommends the Board review, discuss the application and recommend approval of the proposed public art installation.

Background: All private development meeting the applicability requirements of the City's public art ordinance is subject to a public art assessment of one percent of the total dollar amount of a project's total construction costs. The public art assessment is capped at \$100,000. In general, there are four methods available for development projects to satisfy the City's public art requirements. The first option is to provide artwork on site. The second option is to pay a fee in lieu and the third option is a combination of the two. The fourth option is an Alternative Equivalent Proposal, which allows a developer to apply to combine the public art assessment for multiple projects into one larger work of art in lieu of several small works of art.

Option 1. On-site Artwork. Submit documentation evidencing the escrow of funds for a work of art valued in an amount not less than one percent (1%) of the total construction costs and submit an application for approval of the work of art in compliance with this chapter.

# City of Port St. Lucie Public Art Requirements Information Package, Application, and Checklist

# **Applicability**

The public art assessment applies to all private non-residential development projects and all residential development projects with more than 10 units, subdivision plats, new construction, or the renovation or improvement of an existing building where 50% or more of a building is being modified, renovated, expanded, rebuilt or improved by construction. The public art assessment for any single project cannot exceed **\$100,000**.

All applicable private development must elect one of the following assessment methods and submit to the Planning and Zoning Department a completed Public Art Assessment Application and provide a copy of the total construction costs as indicated on the construction contract(s) within 90 days of the issuance of the first building permit or site work permit for a subdivision plat for any portion of the project.

Total Construction Costs means the total cost of the improvements, exclusive of land, approved for a development project, as indicated on the construction contract(s) for the subject improvements.

Option 1	On-site Artwork  A. Submit documentation evidencing the escrow of funds for a valued in an amount not less than 1% of the total construction costs. *  B. Submit an application for approval of the work of art.  C. If a local artist is commissioned, the artwork shall be valued at 90% of 1% of the total construction costs. *  D. Local artist means an artist who resides in St. Lucie, Martin, Indian River, or Okeechobee counties.
Option 2	Contribute to the Art in Public Places Fund  A. Contribute an amount equal to 80% of the 1% of the total construction costs for deposit to the Art in Public Places fund. *
Option 3	On-Site Artwork and Contribute to Fund  A. Submit documentation evidencing the escrow of funds for a work of art valued in an amount not less than one percent (1%) of the total construction costs.  B. Contribute 80% of the balance of the 1% of the total construction costs for deposit in the art in public places fund. *
Option 4	A. Submit an alternative equivalent proposal to the Planning and Zoning Director.  B. The proposal may seek a combination of the public art assessment associated with multiple projects into one larger work of art in lieu of several small works of art.

<sup>\*</sup> If 1% of the total construction costs exceeds \$100,000, the public art assessment is capped at \$100,000, with no further reductions. The cap represents a reduction.

### **Location of Public Art**

Artwork must be located in an exterior place defined as any place, public or private, outdoor and exterior to buildings or structures and exposed to public view, including, but not limited to, buildings, parks, right-of-way medians, and open spaces.

### **Definition of Public Art**

Art, artwork, or work of art means an original physical work created or produced by an **Artist** including, but not limited to:

- paintings
- sculptures
- \*site specific installations
- \*carvings

- statues
- mosaics
- mobiles

•murals

- engraving
- bas reliefs
- frescos

\*collages

Artwork may be free-standing or integrated with the work of other design professionals in a building or site. Artwork may be new or may be an existing work of art.

The following shall not be considered public art or public works of art:

- Art objects that are mass-produced or are of standard manufacture such as playground equipment, fountains, statuary elements, signage, maps, corporate logos, or other functional elements, unless incorporated into an artwork by an artist commissioned for that purpose.
- Reproductions, by mechanical or other means, of original artwork, except in the case of limited editions controlled by the artist, cast sculpture, film, video, photography, printmaking, or other media arts.
- Works that are decorative, ornamental, or functional elements of the architecture or landscape design; except where designed by a visual artist and/or are an integral part of the artwork by the artist.
- Services or utilities necessary to operate and maintain an artwork over time.

### **Application and Approval Process**

### Option 1. On-site Artwork

The developer must submit an electronic copy of the application, via Fusion under the associated project number, for onsite artwork and required attachments to the Planning and Zoning Department for distribution to the Public Art Advisory Board for review and recommendation to the City Council. The item will be scheduled for the next available Public Art Advisory Board meeting. Following review by the Public Art Advisory Board, the item will be scheduled for City Council approval.

Applicants will be expected to provide a short presentation before the Public Art Advisory Board and/or City Council explaining the project, public art proposal, and location. Applicants should be prepared to answer any questions about the proposed art, artist, and/or project. It is strongly recommended that the project team and/or individuals knowledgeable about all aspects of the project and the artwork attend these meetings to avoid the item being tabled if additional information is required.

### Option 2. Contribute to Fund

A contribution in the amount of 80% of 1% of the total construction costs for deposit to the art in public places fund must be paid in full prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy. For subdivision plats, the fee is due in full at the time of recording of the final plat.

# Option 3. On-site Artwork and Contribute to Fund

Follow the procedures outlined in Options 1 and 2.

### **Option 4. Alternative Equivalent Proposal**

The developer must submit an alternative equivalent proposal to the Planning and Zon ing Director. The proposal shall be for the installation of freely accessible work of art on City's public right-of-way, on property owned by other public agencies, or on another property under the control or ownership of the developer. The proposal may seek the combination of the public art assessment associated with multiple projects into one larger work of art in lieu of several small works of art.

### **Enforcement**

Unless an alternative deadline is established in a development order, or a time extension is granted by the Planning and Zoning Director, no Certificate of Occupancy or recording of a subdivision plat for a project subject to the public art assessment will be issued until the artwork is installed and/or the full art assessment has been paid to the city.

The public art assessment is capped at \$100,000. In general, there are four methods available for development projects to satisfy the City's public art requirements. The first option is to provide artwork on site. The second option is to pay a fee in lieu, and the third option is a combination of the two. The applicant has selected Option 1 and proposes to provide on-site artwork.

Issues/Analysis: This proposal offers a large-scale, three-dimensional sculpture inspired by the Import Mex brand identity and the piece features vibrant colors drawn from the Import Mex palette. Import Mex is a wholesale distributor of Mexican and Central American food products and groceries. The approximately 8-foot, faceted steel form transforms the company's visual mark into a bold, abstract public artwork. Designed to reflect light and shadow throughout the day, The sculpture symbolizes movement, connection, and community, serving as a lasting cultural landmark.

# Artwork Description & Site Placement

### **Concept Narrative**

This sculpture is a large-scale, three-dimensional interpretation of the Import Mex identity, transformed into an 8-foot faceted steel form. By expanding the company's visual mark into a fully realized public artwork, the piece moves beyond its origins to become a permanent cultural landmark. The angular planes capture shifting light and shadow throughout the day, while the segmented fields of bold color give the sculpture an immediately recognizable presence. The design embraces abstraction, movement, and connection, allowing the work to resonate not only with Import Mex but also with the broader community in which it is placed.

### **Specifications**

**Dimensions**: ~89.7" H x 89.7" W x 70.0" D (7.5 ft x 7.5 ft x 6 ft)

- Material: Corten Steel body with stainless reinforcement where required
- Finish: High-durability liquid paint, with colorful pattern inspired by the Import Mex palette

- Anchored with three welded steel mounting brackets (detailed in technical drawings) to a reinforced concrete base.


- Could be located in a highly visible area such as an entry plaza, traffic circle, or publicfacing courtyard.
- Orientation can allow for 360° viewing, ensuring clear pedestrian circulation and multiple vantage points.
- Placement should prioritize maximum visibility for both the Import Mex community and the surrounding public.




