The City Manager gave a brief history of the City's ongoing litigation regarding the development of Becker Road.

Attorney Jamie Cole explained that the 3 agreements were the culmination of a year of negotiations and that the current agreement was pending litigation, so he did not want to publicly discuss too much. He added that there was a \$16 million bond being posted by GL Riverland and \$32 million bond being posted by ACR to ensure that

they construct the road in their segment of the property.

Craig Rupestrian, Counsel for ACR explained that the parties originally attempted to negotiate a global settlement agreement, which would resolve litigation, but that the City did not want to do so. (Clerk's Note: At this time, Mr. Rupestrian read an email from Mr. Cole that was sent on November 23, 2021.)

Mayor Martin inquired as to if any representative from Riverland would like to speak on the item, to which there was no response.

Mr. Cole addressed Mr. Rupestrian's comments and explained that it was clear that they were not able to reach a global settlement due to each party wanting different things.

Mayor Martin stated that she would like to discuss and vote on each agreement individually and inquired as to if there were any comments or questions regarding the Mattamy Agreement, to which there were none. There being no discussion, Vice Mayor Caraballo moved to approve the Mattamy Agreement. Councilwoman Morgan seconded the motion. The City Clerk restated the motion as follows: for approval of the Mattamy Agreement. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

Mayor Martin inquired as to if there were any comments or questions regarding the Riverland Agreement, to which there were none. There being no discussion, Vice Mayor Caraballo moved to approve the Riverland Agreement. Councilwoman Morgan seconded the motion. The City Clerk restated the motion as follows: for approval of the Riverland Agreement. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

Mayor Martin inquired as to if there were any comments or questions regarding the ACR Agreement, to which Vice Mayor Caraballo responded that she was disappointed that Mr. Akel did not drop the lawsuit based upon the agreement. She welcomed the opportunity to work and partner together. Vice Mayor Caraballo explained that a big concern from residents was the support of infrastructure as the City continued to grow and that she was happy the City had three signed agreements that would provide the connection from Becker Road to Rangeline Road.

Councilman Bonna stated that the item was very important to his District, and he would be supporting the item.

Councilman Pickett stated that the most important thing was getting the road built for the citizens and that the legal aspect would play itself out. He added that he would be supporting the item.

Councilwoman Morgan echoed the other Council Member's comments.

Mayor Martin stated that she did not have faith in ACR due to past events and that she hoped she would be proven wrong for the sake of the residents. She added that she would not be supporting the item.

Councilwoman Morgan moved to approve the executed version signed by ACR Agreement. Councilman Pickett seconded the motion. Under discussion, Vice Mayor Caraballo stated that it was the will of the Council to continue to work with all of the developers to continue to build a wonderful City. She understood that there were challenges in the past but would like to move forward. The City Clerk restated the motion as follows: for approval of the executed version signed by ACR agreement. The motion passed by roll call vote with Councilman Bonna, Vice Mayor Caraballo, Councilwoman Morgan, Councilman Pickett voting in favor and Mayor Martin voting against.

Councilman Bonna moved to approve Resolution 22-R27. Vice Mayor Caraballo seconded the motion. The City Clerk restated the motion as follows: for approval of Resolution 22-R27 with the approved agreements. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

12. Unfinished Business

12.a City Council Consensus of Proposed Redistricting Map.

The City Attorney explained that staff looked at the four areas of concerns and each area was addressed. He explained that the Ordinance required a detailed written survey on each District, which would be a long process and requested consensus from Council.

Councilman Bonna stated that his main concern was that the City was complying with the law, that the Districts were roughly proportional, and that each Council Member represented all citizens. Councilman Pickett stated that he was happy Torino was not split in half and was happy with the proposed map. Councilwoman Morgan stated that she would like to keep neighborhoods together but understood that it was not possible.

It was consensus of the Council to move forward with the Proposed Redistricting Map.

Vice Mayor Caraballo stated that she was happy with the City Manager's performance, but felt he was underpaid and supported a 5% pay increase along with an additional 2 weeks of leave.

Councilman Bonna, Councilman Pickett, and Councilwoman Morgan all spoke highly of the City Manager and supported Vice Mayor Caraballo's comments.

Mayor Martin stated that the City Manager was always there to listen, respond, and answer the phone. She added that it was her pleasure to increase the City Manager's pay rate and vacation time.

There being no further discussion, Vice Mayor Caraballo moved to approve to increase the City Manager's salary by 5% and an additional 2 weeks of personal leave. Councilwoman Morgan seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

14. City Manager's Report

The City Manager noted that there was a mediation scheduled with WastePro on February 16th and that the Department of Environmental Protection had recognized the Glades Water Treatment Plant with the 2021 Award of Excellence. The City

Manager gave an update on which projects were approved through the Site Plan Review Committee.
