13.a Discuss Request for the City's Sponsorship of VETFEST

(Clerk's Note: A PowerPoint presentation was shown at this time.) Councilman Pickett requested the City make In-Kind donations for sponsorship and stated that he wished to make this an annual event. He also requested that the Lion's Club be in charge of beer & alcohol sales and asked for assistance from the Communications Department for advertising and promotion. Councilwoman Morgan inquired on how they could draw a line for providing the funds for this event so that it would not happen for future events, to which Mayor Martin replied that it was a City-sponsored event so it would go along with the other City events, and City Manager Merejo stated that this particular event was going to be brought to Council either in the Winter or Summer Council Workshops, and it would be up to Council to decide if they wished to do the event as this time, or if they would like to wait for the Workshop and have everything presented to them as a package. Vice Mayor Caraballo stated that she agreed that this should not only be a City-sponsored event, but something that the Council would consider as a future event, and she recommended having further discussions at the Winter Workshop. Councilman Bonna announced that he was in support of this and also wished to have further discussion.

It was the consensus of the City Council to bring this item to the Winter Workshop.

There being no further discussion, Councilwoman Morgan moved to approve VetFest. Councilman Bonna seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

13.b Approve a Site Plan for Stars and Stripes Park in Southern Grove (P22-195).
