Budget Advisory Coming (BAC) Roads Impact Fee Recommendations

Interlocal agreements are the keystone in providing opportunities for improvement and solutions that benefit all of the citizens represented by the multiple jurisdictions involved.

1. Annual Impact Fee Report – St. Lucie County (SLC) should provide an Annual Impact Fee Report to Port St. Lucie (PSL) by a certain date each year. Refine the annual report to provide explicit documentation of revenues and expenditures for SLC impact fees collected on PSL development.

2. Renegotiate Interlocal Agreements:

- **a.** Port St. Lucie (PSL) should consider a performance-based contract with an experienced negotiator to assist in negotiating the terms of all interlocal agreements.
- **b.** All Interlocal agreements should be revisited and specific to the category. Boilerplate from roads may not fit the category of Fire, Libraries, etc.
- **c.** Consider a broader interlocal agreement between PSL and SLC regarding the provision of roads by multiple funding sources.
- d. Remove language from the interlocal agreements that provide broad discretion to SLC.
- **e.** Add language incorporating the annual budget process that includes PSL approval of SLC use of PSL impact fees.
- **f.** PSL should review the Interlocal Agreement with the School Board for school siting and planning and with the St. Lucie County Fire District and determine if renegotiation is necessary.
- g. Consider using 100 percent of funding that must be spent on City road needs as another method of allocating impact fee funding, rather than a list of roads, and update the list of roads within the Interlocal agreement based on the change in traffic patterns that have resulted from the opening of the Cross-Town Parkway, and the use of Prima Vista, and other completed road projects, and the new revenue sources of the County.
- h. Administrative fees should reflect actual costs and may be reassessed each fiscal year.
- **3.** Reserves SLC needs to document any reserves. Reserve balances should be negotiated and specific to negotiated projects (currently at \$22.5 million). PSL should review the City project "wish" list to determine if impact fees can be dedicated to those projects that are required by and benefit the new development.
- **4. Intergovernmental Coordination between PSL and SLC-** Consider structuring a procedure that requires cooperation during the jurisdiction's budget preparation process annually and

a provision that the County's expenditures of Port St. Lucie impact fees be submitted to the City's.

Representation on County Citizen Budget Development Committee

- i. PSL should have an equal or proportionate amount of city residents on the County Citizens Budget Development Committee.
- ii. They should be recommended by City Council.
- iii. Representation should be based proportionately on population.
- **5. Impact Fee Study (in progress) -** PSL may want to adjust its impact fees based on the results of the Impact Fee Study currently underway.
- **Mobility Fee** PSL may wish to contract with a Consultant to prepare a study on the use of Mobility Fees.
