

books were distributed at community events and through local partnerships








#### **COVID-19 RESPONSE**



- Purchased over \$200,000 of PPE (masks, sanitation equipment/supplies), basic needs (diapers, food, etc), technology to allow for tele-health model of service delivery.
   Leveraged an additional \$200,000 for other funders
- **Operation Dinner Table** partnership with Boys and Girls Club and Children's Services Council after-school providers to provide meals to over 2,000 families
- Small Business Big Challenge partnership with Chamber to support non-profit organizations and local businesses
- Partnership with St. Lucie Schools to distribute **SPARKS booklets** to all 1<sup>st</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> grade students with integration into Children's Services Council summer programs
- Learning Launchpad partnership with BOCC utilizing CARES funding to provide COVID safe learning pods to facilitate virtual learning
- Parent Warmline Families of the Treasure Coast established a warmline for struggling parents



Attendance Plus Program: Program is designed to promote regular school attendance and success through targeting of K – 5th graders with five or more unexcused absences. Services expanded to include total of fourteen schools and include case management as well as information/resource referral services






# **OUR IMPACT**

### **Alignment with City's Strategic Plan:**

- Before & After-School Care
  - Between Children's Services Council's community-based programs, and school-based sites, there are:
    - 18 Port St. Lucie locations



of youth in participating programs improved or maintained their academic performance



of youth in participating programs increased judgment, decision making and social interaction skills to avoid delinquency referrals



of youth in participating programs recorded less than 3 school absences each quarter

For the area, the average costs per child for before/after-school care is approximately \$1,500 - \$2,000 per child for a year

## **NEEDS FOR FAMILIES**

### **MENTAL HEALTH**

- Children's/Families' stressors exacerbated during COVID:
  - Expanding
     Supporting
     Families in Crisis
  - Pilot project to embed mental health services into after-school programs

#### **ACCESSIBILITY**

- Transportation for after-school/summer programs
- Affordable locations for after-school programs
- Costs to families
   particularly sibling
   groups for after-school
   and summer programs

#### **AWARENESS**

- Families' knowledge of resources
- Obstacles/fear of asking for help/assistance

# POSSIBLE STRATEGIES FOR PARTNERSHIP

### **MENTAL HEALTH**

- Partner to expand embedded mental health services into City's after-school and summer activities
- Integrate Social Emotional Learning into City's activities
- Communication strategy to change stigma of mental health and promote help available

#### **ACCESSIBILITY**

- Expand facility use for summer and afterschool thru partnership with funded programs
- Apply for Summer Learning funding to help offset costs for families
