SUBJECT: 2022 Legislative Session – Week 5 (February 7-11)

Reaching the halfway mark, the appropriation process took center stage as the House and Senate both heard their respective budgets in their appropriations committees. As well, the topic of redistricting continues to face complications between the Florida Supreme Court, the Governor and the Legislature. Also in the crosshairs is priority legislation of Senate President Simps on regarding Lake Okeechobee. Measures encompassing data privacy, nursing homes, and construction defect claims are progressing in hopes to hit the desk of Governor DeSantis. These and other topics are covered in our summary of the week in Tallahassee.

City Activities

THANK YOU for the members of council and staff that visited Tallahassee this week. We had productive meetings with legislators, agency heads and pushed forward several important appropriation and policy initiatives.

Both the House and Senate's Appropriations Committees reviewed their respective budgets and ultimately approved them. Those budgets will now be reviewed by the entire House and Senate during week 6, which will set up for the eventual budget conference. As reportedly previously, the Southern Grove Jobs Corridor Water Main Project and C-23 projects are in one of the budgets and eligible for Budget Conference (see notes below).

HB 2053 and Senate LFIR 2262 – City of Port St. Lucie Tradition Regional Park – \$500,000 – Approved by Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Agenda on January 19 – **Did not make budget.**

HB 2389 and Senate LFIR 2263 – Port St. Lucie River/C-23 Water Quality Restoration Project Area 7A Design – \$416,875 – Approved by Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Committee – **\$208,438 in House Budget, Line 1665A.**

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HB 2391 and Senate LFIR 2264 – Port St. Lucie Southern Grove Jobs Corridor Water Main Project - \$1,774,150 – Approved by Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Committee – \$500,000 in Senate Budget, Line 1665A.

Notable Topics

Emergency Funds - \$500 Million for Governor

Lawmakers were successful in their second attempt to create a rainy-day fund for the Governor's Office. In its final stop, the House voted 95-22 on an Emergency Preparedness and Response Fund (SB 96) for \$500 million. In this bill, the Governor may use these funds in the case of an emergency before using other sources of money. The House bill sponsor, Rep. Trabulsy, expressed this measure will "gives us time to respond to the emergency while protecting our power to appropriate and protect our reserve." The bill now awaits the decision of the Governor.

Data Privacy – Business Put in Crosshairs over Data

The issue over data privacy is faced once more in the legislature. At its first committee stop (Commerce), HB 9 advanced with a unanimous vote after receiving concerns over the financial aspect from business owners. This measure gives consumers the right to determine what information is collected, the option to delete or correct the data, and opt-out of the sale or sharing of personal information. The bill sponsor, Rep. McFarland and proponents argue for the necessity of this proposal, mentioning consumers should have a say in sales for digital advertising or manipulation. Representative Clemons criticized business lobbyists who spoke against the bill and gave "specious arguments." McFarland removed the opportunity for class action lawsuits, but opponents still worry over the private cause of action that they believe would allow for frivolous lawsuits.

Construction Defect Claims – Homebuilders and Trial Bar Square Off

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The statute of repose for construction claims may be shortened. Senate Bill 736 (Hutson) hit the Senate floor on Thursday, and was amended in an effort to find compromise amongst the various stakeholders. The bill, as amended, changes the number of years that homeowners have to file claims over all defects to seven years except when fraud is involved. The amendment saves the ten-year period for cases when a homeowner alleges builders fraudulently concealed the reported defect. Originally, the proposal gave five years to file construction defects claims over single-family residences and maintained a ten-year repose period for all other defects. Senator Hutson, the bill sponsor, stated the importance to “establish a clear and fair process for addressing a construction defect.” Senators will vote on the full measure in their next meeting while the companion bill, HB 583 (Yarborough), awaits its final committee hearing (Judiciary). Both versions have yet to define material violations in statute.

Term Limits & Textbook Limitations – Don’t Read This

A bill that includes an eight-year term limit for school board members combined with a requirement for schools to post library and classroom books online was passed by the House. House Bill 1467 also includes a training program for library staff led by the Florida Department of Education and mandates local meetings on instructional material to be put on notice and open to the public. Representative Garrison’s reasoning for this bill was to “provide transparency to reinforce for parents the security and confidence that comes with knowing they can drop their kids off at the local library and be comfortable where they are.” Democratic members viewed it as an attempt to “ban books and silence narratives of marginalized populations.” Their argument referenced the banning of a book about the Holocaust and stated this measure would cause more of these kinds of bans. After a 78-40 vote, it is now up to the Senate to revise their version that includes discrepancies with key issues.

Nursing Homes – Wanted Ads Get Boost

Aiming to address the nursing staff shortage, SB 804 requires nursing homes to provide a resident with two hours of certified nursing assistant care. Debate arises from the amended version which requires 3.6 hours of “direct care” to the resident instead of “nursing care.” Direct care staff is defined by individuals who supply care and services to allow residents to reach or maintain their highest physical, mental, and psychosocial well-being. Staff can include physicians, occupational therapy, mental health service workers, etc. With only one no vote by Sen. Jones, this measure advanced to its next hearing in Community Affairs.

Public Records Exemption – Presidential Searches

Senate Bill 520 by Sen. Brandes classifies candidate’s personal information who seek college or university presidential positions. However, 21 days before a final selection, details must be released to the public. On the Senate floor, a supermajority vote was needed as it pertains to changing the state’s sunshine laws. After years tackling this issue, a 28-11 vote was recorded. The House version, HB 703, awaits its last committee but differs with a 14-day unveiling candidates. Brandes says the Senate will not budge on the time limit.

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Congressional Redistricting – Will a Jax to Tallahassee District Unwind the Process?

Work on congressional maps were put on a hold while awaiting an important verdict. After submitting his own map proposal, Gov. DeSantis asked for an advisory opinion regarding whether a 200-mile congressional district that links black neighborhoods must be kept intact. This district stretches from downtown Jacksonville to Tallahassee and is labeled as a minority access district. In a unanimous decision, the Florida Supreme Court rejected his request. The opinion stated the question was too broad and dealt with complex issues involving federal and state constitutional matters as well as the interpretation of the Voting Rights Act of 1965. Evidence would be needed to conduct a review of Florida's 5th congressional district. A House map dropped on Thursday that keeps Rep. Lawson's district mostly intact. Some differences arise between the Senate maps including a likely turn of a Central Florida Democratic seat into Republican. During a press availability on Friday, the Governor indicated he would veto any map that preserved the disputed district. The cartography on these maps appears to be far from done.

Lake Okeechobee – A Tale of the Senate and the Governor

Filed last Friday as one of several conforming bills to SB 2500 (General Appropriations Act), SB 2508 demands the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) give recommendations to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers regarding the amount of existing water legal users hold and states that it should not be reduced. Environmental advocates and small business owners suggest the bill intends to protect sugar farmers and ensures the industry gets the necessary water needed even when levels in the Okeechobee drop. In response to the arguments against the bill, Chair of Senate's Agriculture and Natural Resources Appropriations Committee Albritton asserts the measure is only asking for greater accountability from the SFWMD to follow policies and laws. The measure passed with a 16-4 vote and is now a part of the budget measures that will be negotiated on both sides. While environmentalists sought opposition to this bill, they found a major ally: the Governor. On Thursday, Governor DeSantis released a statement admonishing the process and substance of SB 2508 and stated that he rejects "any attempt to deprioritize the EAA Reservoir project south of Lake Okeechobee."
