The enclosed Ordinance has been reviewed and revised by the City Attorney's Office with respect to the request for an abandonment of a portion of a twenty (20) foot wide Drainage and Utility Easement affecting Lot 6, Block 1450, Port St. Lucie Section Fifteen, recorded in Plat Book 13, Page(s) 6, 6A to 6E, of the Public Records of St. Lucie County, Florida. The owner has submitted the Abandonment of Easement Application.

The request for the abandonment of a portion of a twenty (20) foot wide Drainage and Utility Easement affecting the subject property and all supporting documentation have been reviewed and approved as to legal form and sufficiency. As such, the attached Ordinance has been prepared for presentment to the City Council for review and approval.
