# National Community Survey – Proposed Custom Question #1: Half Cent Sales Tax Renewal Draft Question

The City is considering a ballot initiative for November 2026 that would ask voters to renew an existing half-cent sales tax for ten more years. These funds have paid for several major road, sidewalk and water quality projects since 2018. The projects listed below have been requested by residents through prior surveys and the Citizen Summit. To what extent would you support or oppose financing each project with this sales tax in the future if it wins approval?

- 1. Improving traffic flow through widening roadways including St. Lucie West Boulevard.
- 2. Improving traffic flow through widening roadways including Torino Parkway.
- 3. Improving traffic flow through multiple intersection improvements and the addition of roundabouts on key corridors including Southbend, Rosser/Dreyfuss; Selvitz/Peachtree; California/Cameo; Crosstown/Cashmere; Melaleuca/ Green River and Melaleuca/Berkshire and Macedo/Selvitz Intersections.
- 4. Improving traffic flow by upgrading traffic signal technology systems and coordination enhancements including on Village Parkway and Becker Road.
- 5. Improving north/south traffic flow by building a new bridge over the C-24 canal connecting Savage Boulevard to Del Rio Boulevard.
- 6. Improving access for emergency vehicles to support lifesaving response times through traffic signal pre-emptions throughout the city.
- 7. Improving connectivity and pedestrian safety in the Sandpiper neighborhood through improving existing roundabouts and sidewalk improvements.
- 8. Land acquisition for parks, green space and water quality improvements.
- 9. Installing sidewalks city-wide for areas identified based on safety and the need for neighborhood connections, including to parks.

- 10. Increasing access to shade by building shade/canopies and planting additional trees in parks and along streets.
- 11. Repaving and resurfacing of roadways.
- 12. Stormwater and beautification improvements including drainage improvements to reduce flooding at Savona/California, Elkham Basin & Thornhill Drive, and throughout central Port St. Lucie.
