1. Meeting Called to Order

A Regular Meeting of the CITY COUNCIL of the City of Port St. Lucie was called to order by Mayor Martin on July 11, 2022, at 6:35 p.m., at Port St. Lucie City Hall, 121 SW Port St. Lucie Boulevard, Port St. Lucie, Florida.

3. Invocation & Pledge of Allegiance

Mayor Martin led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Proclamations and Special Presentations

4.a Proclamation: Parks & Recreation Month

Mayor Martin announced July as Parks & Recreation Month, and Kelly Tiger, Special Events Administrator for the Parks & Recreation Department, spoke on behalf of the Proclamation.

4.b Proclamation: Glioblastoma Awareness Day

Mayor Martin announced July 20th as Glioblastoma Day and presented the Proclamation to Alice Hughes Blanco and Stephanie West of the Brain Cancer Foundation of the Treasure Coast, who spoke on behalf of the Proclamation.

4.c Solid Waste Services Update to City Council

(Clerk's Note: This item was heard after Item 4d.)
City Manager Blackburn provided updates to residents regarding pickup, recycling, and scheduling. He informed that the City had leased 9 garbage trucks to assist with pickup, as well as enlisting Public Works employees to help. He also stated that recycling will resume in September and garbage and recycling would be on the same day. Councilwoman Morgan asked if pickup was being done on the entire street rather than pinpointing certain homes for those that called in to 1PSL, to which City Manager Blackburn replied that they pickup both sides and would not respond to just one person's call. Councilwoman Morgan stated that since garbage and recycling would be on the same day but with separate bins, education would be needed for residents. Mayor Martin asked if education documentation was going to be provided when the residents received their new cans, to which City Manager Blackburn responded in the affirmative.

Councilman Bonna asked how they would envision using the 9 new garbage trucks after the transition period, to which City Manager Blackburn replied that they had entered into a 6-month agreement and they would also be used for hurricane season and missed pickups. Vice Mayor Caraballo asked if there were any proactive plans in regard to FCC providing communication when something was not how the City would like to have it, to which City Manager Blackburn responded in the affirmative. Vice Mayor Caraballo asked if Waste Pro had resumed regular yard waste pickup on scheduled days, to which City Manager Blackburn replied that they had reported that, but it was hard to verify. Vice Mayor Caraballo asked if there were any recommendations from staff regarding keeping yard waste in check during hurricane season, to which City Manager Blackburn replied that as there was a time of uncertainty on pickup, waiting to do one's yard trimming would be best, but they could also bring the yard waste to the Cameo Bulk Site to be able to trim as much as they needed instead.
