As required by § 197.3632, Florida Statutes, the City of Port St Lucie, Florida, is providing notice that an annual assessment using the tax bill collection method may be levied on your property. The purpose of the assessment is to provide funding for the Solid Waste Collection, Disposal and Recycling Services, facilities, or programs and the recycling activities of recyclable materials ("services"). The use of an annual special assessment for services within the City of Port St. Lucie has proven to be a fair, efficient, and effective means of funding these services. The unit of measurement to determine the assessment is calculated by multiplying the number of dwelling units on each parcel by the rate of assessment.

The assessment rate per dwelling unit for fiscal year 2022/2023 was: \$416.21

The proposed annual increase to the assessment rate per dwelling unit: \$ 16.46

The proposed amount to be levied per dwelling unit for fiscal year 2023/2024 is: \$432.67

The total number of dwelling units calculated for the above referenced parcel is "Unit" for which the City proposes a net assessment of \$"Amount" for fiscal year 2023/24. Unpaid or delinquent fees, charges or assessments due the City for solid waste and recyclable materials management and disposal services allocable to specific parcels will be additionally included in the solid waste service assessment.

The total revenue the City will collect by the assessment is estimated to be \$ 37,551,429.30 for fiscal year 2023/2024. The solid waste assessment will be levied and collected in the same manner as ad valorem taxes by the Tax Collector of St. Lucie County and will appear on the "non-ad valorem" portion of the November 2023 tax bill and future bills. Failure to pay the solid waste service assessment will cause a tax certificate to be issued against the property or foreclosure proceedings to be instituted, either of which may result in a loss of title to the property.

The Public Hearing will be held during the regular City Council meeting on Monday, September 11, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. in Council Chambers, City Hall, 121 SW Port St. Lucie Blvd, Port St. Lucie, Florida. All affected property owners have the right to appear and to file written objections with the City Council through the City Clerk within twenty (20) days of the date of this notice. Attendance at this public hearing is NOT mandatory. Please visit www.CityofPSL.com/tv for public comment options. At the hearing, City Council will consider comments and objections to the solid waste assessment roll and consider the assessment roll as final with any changes, as necessary. Upon the filing of such assessment roll with the St. Lucie County Tax Collector, the assessments shall stand as legal, valid and binding liens, and pursuant to Section 170 et seq., Florida Statutes, co-equal with the lien of all state, county, district, and municipal taxes, superior in dignity to all other liens, titles, and claims, until paid. You may also direct general inquiries to 1PSL at 772-871-1775 and press 5, Monday through Friday, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

No stenographic record by a certified court reporter will be provided at the hearing. If you decide to appeal any decision made by the City Council with respect to any matter considered at the hearing, you will be responsible for making a verbatim record of the testimony, evidence, and any other matters presented at the hearing. In accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, persons requesting accommodations should contact the ADA Coordinator at 772-344-4345 at least seven (7) days prior to the hearing.

Unless proper steps are initiated with a court of competent jurisdiction to secure relief within thirty (30) days from the date of City Council action at the above hearing, such action shall be the final adjudication of the issues presented. General Information and Commonly Asked Questions

Why is the assessment amount increasing?

Per the Franchise Agreement with FCC Environmental Services, the Solid Waste rate is subject to a Consumer Price Index increase each year, not to exceed 4% in any one year.

In 2022, the City provided a one-time credit of \$36.76 due to Waste Pro's extremely poor service. This credit will not be applied this year. (The one-time credit was applied to those who received a tax bill in November 2022. If you purchased your home after May 1, 2022, you either received a partial credit or did not receive a credit.)

What is a non-ad valorem assessment?

Non-ad valorem assessments are fees for specific services, such as stormwater and solid waste. The amount you pay is not based on your property's value. However, it is billed separately on your property tax bill.

Do I need to respond to this Notice or appear at the Public Hearing?

No. This notice is required to provide information; however, a response is not required.

What services are provided by the assessment? The assessment pays for:

solid waste collection, yard waste and recycling collection once **per week**. Bulk Item pickup once **per month**. Clam truck services are included at no extra charge with some limited exceptions.

Are these new assessments?

If this Notice is "Not a Bill" – when is the assessment billed?

Assessments approved at the public hearing will be billed via the property tax bill and collected by the St. Lucie County Tax Collector. To avoid penalties, the property tax bill must be paid in full to the Tax Collector by March 31.

Why did I receive this Notice?

As an owner of property in Florida, you have a right to receive specific information about property taxes and non-ad valorem assessments.
