Project Overview

Executive Summary

 Import Mex of Florida, LLC purchased a 23-acre parcel in the Tradition Center for Commerce. The company will construct a 160,000-sf distribution facility and corporate headquarters.

Project Overview

- The capital investment will include \$30,9 million in new construction and \$1.8 million in machinery/equipment.
- The company will create 121 new high-wage jobs paying an average of \$55,515 plus benefits.

Impact and Mobility Fee Mitigation

- Import Mex of Florida, LLC is eligible to receive an impact and mobility fee mitigation up to \$3,500 per new full-time job created, based on the average wage of \$55,515, which is above \$t. Lucie County's average wage.
- The total amount of the impact and mobility fee mitigation is up to \$423,500. The total impact and mobility fee is \$79,153.
- The company will create 121 new high-wage jobs, with 91 jobs created in year 1, 9 jobs in year 2, 8 jobs in year 3, 8 jobs in year 4 and 5 jobs in year 5.
- The company commits to create and retain 121 jobs for a period of ten years from the date of issuance of the certificate of occupancy.
- If the company fails to meet the performance standards it will be required to pay the waived impact and mobility fees on a pro rate basis for each year or partial year it is out of compliance.
- The impact and mobility fee will be paid from the Tradition Economic Development Fund and sales proceeds from lands owned by the Governmental Finance Corporation.



Recommendation

 The staff recommends the City Council approve the impact and mobility fee mitigation agreement for Import Mex of Florida, LLC's expansion to Port St. Lucie.
