Ms. Beckett discussed the trees to be dispersed during the annual KPSLB Tree Giveaway and the Appreciation Night at the stadium. It was also noted that there was an agreement with Clover Field for advertising.

6.c Caring Community Cleanup April 11, 2026

Ms. Beckett discussed the Community Cleanup and the request for donations, as well as donations already made. It was also noted that Keurig/Dr. Pepper donated water, FCC and Walmart donated lunch, and Dragonfly Graphics created the t-shirts. Mr. Cerami inquired if City Departments would be setting up booths, to which Ms. Beckett replied that some would be and she also discussed the other booths to be in attendance.

6.d KPSLB Volunteer Appreciation Breakfast June 27, 2026

Ms. Beckett discussed the annual breakfast for the Adopt-A-Street volunteers. Chair Knott recommended an award for groups who referred the most people. Ms. Feldpausch also noted that she was working with Ms. Diaz-Ott on a referral button on the website.

Ms. Beckett stated that a JotForm was created for the Cigarette Litter Prevention Program referrals, allowing businesses to sign up to receive an ashtray outside their establishment. She also noted that she requested an additional \$5,000 to fund cigarette trays.

6.e Adopt-A-Street Best Group Photo Selection [2026-279](#)

Ms. Beckett requested that the Committee vote for the best photo, to which the group photo of the Crosstown Running Club won with 4 votes.

6.f Approve the New 2026 KPSLB Community Shred Event [2026-280](#)

Ms. Beckett stated that they could use their grant funds for a shred event but noted that it does not pay for labor. Ms. Diaz-Ott provided information on a 2015 shred event held by the Police Department during International Fraud Week, and she noted that there was a Fraud Week coming up in May as well, to which Ms. Beckett informed that funds needed to be submitted June 30th, hence the earlier date. Ms. Beckett then discussed potential locations.

Mr. Barned moved to move the Shred Event to calendars & events. Mr. Kendrick seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

The Committee further discussed the locations, noting that the two school layouts were good options due to having one entry/exit point, but that the gates may be locked. Ms. Beckett stated that it may be within the contract to have the gates open, and that she has reached out to the schools and was awaiting a response.
