A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE PRELIMINARY AND FINAL PLAT FOR STARS AND STRIPES IN THE PARK WITHIN THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE, FLORIDA, ON THE REQUEST OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE (P22-224).

WHEREAS, the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida has been requested by Lucido and Associates., acting as the agent for the City of Port St. Lucie (owner) to approve the preliminary and final plat for Stars and Stripes in the Park within the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida; and

WHEREAS, there are no required improvements, *i.e.*, roads, drainage, and utility facilities, to be constructed within the platted area by the developer; and

That the City Council hereby approves the preliminary and final plat for Stars and Stripes in the Park within the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida, said plat being offered by the City of Port St. Lucie, as owner and title holder of said property and as prepared by Ronnie L. Furniss, Professional Surveyor Mapper, Caulfield and Wheeler, Inc., as designated on the attached Plat.

<u>Section 4.</u> That the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida, are hereby authorized to countersign the said plat so it may be properly recorded in the public records of St. Lucie County, Florida.

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Conflict.</u> If any resolutions, or parts of resolutions, are in conflict herewith, this Resolution shall control to the extent of the conflicting provisions.

Section 6. Severability. The provisions of this Resolution are intended to be severable.
