CONTRACT TERM: This is a Piggyback Agreement based off of City of Orlando's Contract # IFB20-0379 for Liquid Chlorine Cylinders with Brenntag Mid-South, Inc. Estimated annual expenditures are \$250,000. Future expenditures for projects will be as appropriated in each year's budget. **The Unit Price for this Contract is \$512.00 per one ton cylinder.**

The initial term began on August 11, 2020 through August 10, 2023 with a renewal option of two (2) additional twelve (12) month periods.

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE
CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE, FLORIDA
AND
BRENNTAG MID-SOUTH, INC.
FOR
LIQUID CHLORINE CYLINDERS
(PIGGYBACK COMPETITIVE AWARD)**

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of the date last entered below by and between the **CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE**, a Florida municipal corporation, whose mailing address is 121 SW Port St. Lucie Blvd., Port St. Lucie, FL 34894 ("City" or "Purchaser") and **BRENNTAG MID-SOUTH, INC.**, whose mailing address is 1405 Highway 136 West, Henderson, KY 42420 ("Contractor"). City and Contractor may be referred to herein individually as a "party" or collectively as the "parties."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the City requires goods and services of Contractor pursuant to Contract No. IFB20-0379, Liquid Chlorine Cylinders effective August 11, 2020 by City of Orlando to Contractor, Agreement between County and Contractor for Goods and Services, including its amendments and addenda (collectively referred to as "Contract Documents" or as the "Contract"); and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to incorporate the terms and conditions of the Contract Documents between the Contractor and City of Orlando, Florida, including any and all contract renewals, amendments and change orders, substituting "City of Orlando, Florida" and/or "City" for the "City of Port St. Lucie" in all places; and

WHEREAS, the City of Port St. Lucie has the authority to enter into this Amendment per the amended terms agreed upon by both parties in the September 16, 2020 Addendum to Contract; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that the original procurement was lawful, the Contractor acted at all times in accordance with Florida law when bidding and the competitive procurement method used by City of Orlando, Florida is consistent with the purchasing policies and requirements of the City,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth in this Agreement, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree to modify and supplement the Contract Documents with the following terms and conditions:

Section 1. Whereas. The "whereas" clauses are hereby incorporated herein as forming the intent, purpose and scope of this Agreement.

Section 2. Terms. The parties agree that pursuant to an addendum between the Contractor and the lead agency (City of Orlando, Florida) which authorized the City to “piggyback” the Contract, the parties agree as follows:

Contract Term: The initial term began on August 11, 2020 and will remain in effect through August 10, 2023 with a renewal option of two (2) additional 12 month periods.

Contract Pricing: \$512.00 per dry ton.

Delivery Time: Deliveries shall be made between the hours of 7:00 AM-5:00 PM E.S.T. Monday thru Friday.

Delivery Locations: James E. Anderson Water Plant (7599 NW LTC Parkway, Port St. Lucie, FL 34986) and Prineville Reverse Osmosis Water Treatment Facility (900 SE Ogden Lane, Port St. Lucie, Florida 34983).

A. Except where the context requires otherwise, such as for, but not limited to, compliance with City ordinances and regulations, City of Port St. Lucie shall be deemed substituted for City of Orlando, Florida with regard to any and all provisions of the Contract and Contract Documents, including by example, and not limitation, with regard to bond requirements, insurance, indemnification, licensing, termination, default and ownership of documents. All recitals, representations, and warranties of Contractor made in the Contract are restated as if set forth fully herein, made for the benefit of City, and incorporated herein.

B. In the event of conflict between the Contract, Contract Documents or this Agreement, the terms and conditions in this Agreement shall supersede and take precedent over the Contract.

C. Nothing in this Agreement, amendments or any other Contract Documents shall be deemed to affect the rights, privileges, and immunities of the City as set forth in s. 768.28, Florida Statutes, nor shall be a waiver of City’s sovereign immunity, whether by contract or by law.

D. The parties acknowledge and agree that the effectiveness of the Agreement are contingent upon approval and an annual budget appropriation by the City Council.

E. The City may be tax exempt and will share its tax-exempt certificate upon request.

F. The City reserves the right to terminate this Agreement or related amendments, attachments or addenda at any time with or without cause without penalty.

G. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida without regard to any conflict of law provision. Venue shall be in St. Lucie County, Florida.

H. The parties agree that in all instances the City’s liability is limited to the monetary amounts set forth in s. 768.28, Florida Statutes.

I. Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless, the City, its officers, agents, and employees from, and against any and all claims, actions, liabilities, losses and expenses including, but not limited to, attorney's fees for personal, economic or bodily injury, wrongful death, loss of or damage to property, at law or in equity, which may arise or may be alleged to have risen from the negligent acts, errors, omissions or other wrongful conduct of the Contractor, agents, laborers, subcontractors or other personnel entity acting under the Contractor's control in connection with the Contractor's performance of services under this Contract and to that extent the Contractor shall pay such claims and losses and shall pay all such costs and judgments which may issue from any lawsuit arising from such claims and losses including wrongful termination or allegations of discrimination or harassment, and shall pay all costs and attorney's fees expended by the City in defense of such claims and losses including appeals. The aforesaid hold-harmless Contract by the Contractor shall apply to all damages and claims for damages of every kind suffered, or alleged to have been suffered, by reason of any of the aforesaid operations of the Contractor or any agent laborers, subcontractors or employee of the Contractor regardless of whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to be applicable to any of such damages or claims for damages. This indemnification shall survive the termination of this Contract.

Section 3. Insurance Requirements. The Contractor shall, on a primary basis and at its sole expense, agree to maintain in full force and effect at all times during the life of this Contract, insurance coverage, limits, including endorsements, as described herein. The requirements contained herein, as well as City's review or acceptance of insurance maintained by Contractor are not intended to and shall not in any manner limit or qualify the liabilities and obligations assumed by Contractor under the Contract.

The parties agree and recognize that it is not the intent of the City of Port St. Lucie that any insurance policy/coverage that it may obtain pursuant to any provision of this Contract will provide insurance coverage to any entity, corporation, business, person, or organization, other than the City of Port St. Lucie and the City shall not be obligated to provide any insurance coverage other than for the City of Port St. Lucie or extend its sovereign immunity pursuant to Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, under its self insured program. Any provision contained herein to the contrary shall be considered void and unenforceable by any party. This provision does not apply to any obligation imposed on any other party to obtain insurance coverage for this project, any obligation to name the City of Port St. Lucie as an additional insured under any other insurance policy, or otherwise protect the interests of the City of Port St. Lucie as specified in this Contract.

1. Workers' Compensation Insurance & Employer's Liability: The Contractor shall agree to maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance & Employers' Liability in accordance with Section 440, Florida Statutes. Employers' Liability and must include limits of at least \$100,000.00 each accident, \$100,000.00 each disease/employee, \$500,000.00 each disease/maximum. A Waiver of Subrogation endorsement shall be provided. Coverage shall apply on a primary basis. Should scope of work performed by Contractor qualify its employee for benefits under Federal Workers' Compensation Statute (example, U.S. Longshore & Harbor Workers Act or Merchant Marine Act), proof of appropriate Federal Act coverage must be provided.

2. Commercial General Liability Insurance: The Contractor shall agree to maintain Commercial General Liability insurance issued under an Occurrence form basis, including Contractual liability, to cover the hold harmless agreement set forth herein, with limits of not less than:

Each occurrence	\$1,000,000
Personal/advertising injury	\$1,000,000
Products/completed operations aggregate	\$2,000,000
General aggregate	\$2,000,000
Fire damage	\$100,000 any 1 fire
Medical expense	\$10,000 any 1 person

3. Additional Insured: An Additional Insured endorsement **must** be attached to the certificate of insurance (should be CG2026) under the General Liability policy. Coverage is to be written on an occurrence form basis. Coverage shall apply on a primary and non-contributory basis. A per project aggregate limit endorsement should be attached. Defense costs are to be in addition to the limit of liability. A waiver of subrogation shall be provided in favor of the City. Coverage shall extend to independent contractors, and fellow employees. Contractual Liability is to be included. Coverage is to include a cross liability or severability of interests provision as provided under the standard ISO form separation of insurers clause.

Except as to Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability, said Certificate(s) and policies shall clearly state that coverage required by the Contract has been endorsed to include the City of Port St. Lucie, a municipality of the State of Florida, its officers, agents and employees as Additional Insured added to its Commercial General Liability policy and Business Auto policy. The name for the Additional Insured endorsement issued by the insurer shall read "**City of Port St. Lucie, a municipality of the State of Florida, its officers, employees and agents and shall include Contract # 20200107 – LIQUID CHLORINE CYLINDERS Project shall be listed as additionally insured.**". The Policies shall be specifically endorsed to provide thirty (30) day written notice to the City prior to any adverse changes, cancellation, or non-renewal of coverage thereunder. In the event that the statutory liability of the City is amended during the term of this Contract to exceed the above limits, the Contractor shall be required, upon thirty (30) days written notice by the City, to provide coverage at least equal to the amended statutory limit of liability of the City. Copies of the Additional Insured endorsements shall be attached to the Certificate of Insurance.

4. Automobile Liability Insurance: The Contractor shall agree to maintain Business Automobile Liability at a limit of liability not less than \$1,000,000.00 each accident covering any auto, owned, non-owned and hired automobiles. In the event, the Contractor does not own any automobiles; the Business Auto Liability requirement shall be amended allowing Contractor to agree to maintain only Hired & Non-Owned Auto Liability. This amended requirement may be satisfied by way of endorsement to the Commercial General

Liability, or separate Business Auto Coverage form. Certificate holder must be listed as additional insured. A waiver of subrogation shall be provided. Coverage shall apply on a primary and non-contributory basis.

5. **Waiver of Subrogation:** The Contractor shall agree by entering into this Contract to a Waiver of Subrogation for each required policy. When required by the insurer, or should a policy condition not permit an Insured to enter into a pre-loss Contract to waive subrogation without an endorsement then Contractor shall agree to notify the insurer and request the policy be endorsed with a Waiver of Transfer of Rights of Recovery Against Others, or its equivalent. This Waiver of Subrogation requirement shall not apply to any policy where a condition to the policy specifically prohibits such an endorsement, or voids coverage should Contractor enter into such a Contract on a pre-loss basis.
6. **Deductibles:** All deductible amounts shall be paid for and be the responsibility of the Contractor for any and all claims under this Contract. Where an SIR or deductible exceeds \$5,000, the City of Port St. Lucie reserves the right, but not obligation, to review and request a copy of the bidder's most recent annual report or audited financial statement.

It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to ensure that all independent contractors and/or subcontractors comply with the same insurance requirements referenced herein. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to obtain Certificates of Insurance from all contractors and subcontractors listing the City as an Additional Insured without the language, when required by written contract.

The Contractor may satisfy the minimum limits required above for either Commercial General Liability, Business Auto Liability, or Employers' Liability coverage under Umbrella or Excess Liability. The Umbrella or Excess Liability shall have an Aggregate limit not less than the highest "Each Occurrence" limit for either Commercial General Liability, Business Auto Liability, or Employers' Liability. When required by the insurer, or when Umbrella or Excess Liability is written on Non-Follow Form," the City shall be endorsed as an "Additional Insured."

The City, by and through its Risk Management Department, reserves the right, but not obligation, to review, modify, reject, or accept any required policies of insurance including limits, coverages or endorsements, herein from time to time throughout the term of this contract. All insurance carriers must have an AM Best rating of at least A:VII or better.

A failure on the part of the contractor to execute the contract and/or punctually deliver the required insurance, and other documentation may be cause for annulment of the award.

Section 4. Payment and Performance Bonds. N/A.

A failure on the part of the contractor to execute the contract and/or punctually deliver the required insurance, and other documentation may be cause for annulment of the award.

Section 5. Notice. Notice hereunder shall be provided in writing by certified mail return receipt requested, or customarily used overnight transmission with proof of delivery, to the City Manager at the address listed above.

Section 6. Public Records. Contractor understands that City is a public entity whose records are available and open to the public for review and inspection. Contractor agrees to comply with public records laws, specifically to:

- A. Keep and maintain public records required by the CITY to perform the service.
- B. The timeframes and classifications for records retention requirements must be in accordance with the General Records Schedule GS1-SL for State and Local Government Agencies. (See <http://dos.myflorida.com/library-archives/records-management/general-records-schedules>)
- C. Records include all documents, papers, letters, maps, books, tapes, photographs, films, sound recordings, data processing software, or other material, regardless of the physical form, characteristics, or means of transmission, made or received pursuant to law or ordinance or in connection with the transaction of official business with the City. Contractor's records under this Agreement include but are not limited to, supplier/sub engineer invoices and contracts, project documents, meeting notes, emails and all other documentation generated during this Agreement.
- D. Upon request from the CITY's custodian of public records, provide the CITY with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided for by law. If Contractor does not comply with the CITY's request for records, CITY shall enforce the provisions in accordance with the contract.
- E. Ensure that project records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the does not transfer the records to CITY.
- F. Upon completion of the contract, transfer, at no cost, to the CITY all public records in possession of the Contractor or keep and maintain public records required by the CITY to perform the service. If the Contractor transfers all public records to the CITY upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Contractor keeps and maintains public records upon the completion of the contract, the Contractor shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records kept electronically must be provided to the CITY, upon request from the CITY's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the CITY.

- G. A Contractor who fails to provide the public records to the CITY within a reasonable time may also be subject to penalties under Section 119.10, Florida Statutes.

Section 7. Scrutinized Vendors List. By renewing a contract with the City, a Contractor certifies that it and those related entities of Contractor as defined by Florida law are not on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List, created pursuant to § 215.4725, Florida Statutes, and are not engaged in a boycott of Israel. The City may terminate this Agreement if Contractor or any of those related entities of Contractor as defined by Florida law are found to have submitted a false certification or any of the following occur with respect to the company or a related entity: (i) it has been placed on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List, or is engaged in a boycott of Israel, or (ii) for any contract for goods or services of one million dollars or more, it has been placed on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List or the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List, or it is found to have been engaged in business operations in Cuba or Syria. Notwithstanding the preceding, the City reserves the right and may, in its sole discretion, on a case by case basis, to permit a company on such lists or engaged in business operations in Cuba or Syria to be eligible for, bid on, submit a proposal for, or enter into or renew a contract for goods or services of one million dollars or more, or may permit a company on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List to be eligible for, bid on, submit a proposal for, or enter into or renew a contract for goods or services of any amount, should the City determine that the conditions set forth in § 287.135(4), Florida Statutes are met.

This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement between Contractor and City with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement supersedes all prior and contemporaneous negotiations, understandings and agreements, written or oral, between the parties. This Agreement may not be modified except by the parties' mutual agreement set forth in writing and signed by the parties.



In the event that the **Insurer** cancels this policy for any reason other than non-payment of premium, and

the **Insurer** will provide advice of cancellation (the "Advice") via e-mail to each such Certificate Holders within 30 days after the **First Named Insured** provides such information to the **Insurer**; provided, however, that if a specific number of days is not stated above, then the Advice will be provided to such Certificate Holder(s) as soon as reasonably practicable after the **First Named Insured** provides such information to the **Insurer**.




