Beginning in July of 2018, the Port St. Lucie Parks & Recreation Department began a year-long parks and recreation planning process.

Over 1,200 residents participated in an extensive needs assessent process. Two public workshops and various interviews and focus groups were coupled with a statistically-representative mail survey and an online survey to further retrieve information from residents.

Simply put, you spoke and we listened. After a year of collecting your input, we were able to assess your top priorities for parks and recreation improvements and programs.



Facility Priorities


Walking and hiking trails; paved bike trails; natural areas & nature parks; dog parks; outdoor stage & amphitheatre; fitness centers & spa; indoor/outdoor pools, spraygrounds, splash pads and other aquatics; improvements to existing parks, recreation centers and fields; multipurpose athletic fields; new neighborhood and community parks.

Program Priorities

Adult fitness and wellness; nature programs; summer concerts; special events; senior programs.

Our Plan

Implementation of the Parks and Recreation System Vision is estimated to cost over \$200 million in land acquisition and capital improvements, plus approximately \$10 million (+ / - 5% of capital costs) in additional annual operations and maintenance costs. This vision will be implemented in two phases, beginning with a \$50 million, 10-year phase funded from the City's CIP, MSTU and other sources. It is assumed that Phase 2 funding would require a voter-approved bond or sales tax referendum in addition to other funding sources.

FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF THE RIVERWALK PROJECT

Continue progress on the Riverwalk South projects, including Master Plan process for Riverwalk North and South to create a dynamic Riverwalk district.

Est. +/- \$12.4m in 2019 - 2024



PHASE 1 OF TORINO REGIONAL PARK & SPORTS COMPLEX SITE

Design and construct a regional park and sport complex, providing a regional destination for sports, leisure and fitness activities.

Est. +/- \$10.0m in 2023 - 2025



PHASE 1 OF TRADITION REGIONAL PARK & SPORTS COMPLEX SITE

Design and construct a regional park and sport complex, providing a regional destination for sports, leisure and fitness activities.

Est. +/- \$10.0m in 2025 - 2027



DEVELOPMENT & CONSTRUCTION OF ADVENTURE PARK

Design and construct an adventure park complex, providing access to exciting and extreme-level sports such as BMX tracks, skate parks, zip lines and more.

Est. +/- \$4.0m in 2019 - 2022



LAND ACQUISITION FOR JOINT-USE STORMWATER TREATMENT PARK SITES

In collaboration with the City's Utility Systems Department, land acquired for parks sites will also provide stormwater treatment and water quality improvement projects.

Est. +/- \$2.30m in 2025 - 2027



IMPROVEMENTS TO EXISTING PARK SITES

Existing parks may be improved by the introduction of additional amenities or features such as trails, dog parks, splash pads and building improvements.

Est. +/- \$4.70m in 2019 - 2024



DEVELOP APACHE AND WINTERLAKES PARKS

Complete Winterlakes Park and develop the Apache Neighborhood Park model to include playgrounds, pavilions, fishing opportunities and openspace play areas.

Est. +/- \$3.70m in 2019 - 2025



CITY-WIDE TRAIL MASTER PLAN

Develop a safe, comfortable and enjoyable network of on and off-road bikeways, trails and sidewalks, with a long-range goal of providing safe walking and biking transportation routes throughout the City.

Est. +/- \$150,000 in 2025 - 2026
