As a resident of the Cascades community at **303 NW Seacrest Ct**, located less than 750 feet from the proposed **Cashmere Townhomes** development, I am writing to express several concerns regarding the potential impact of this project.

First, the addition of up to 144 vehicles associated with the new townhomes will significantly increase traffic in our area. The roads near the proposed site already experience heavy congestion, particularly during school opening and closing hours, and the additional traffic would further worsen what is already a challenging situation.

Second, the development may negatively affect the overall appearance and character and along with noise pollution of the Cascades over 55 community, I respectfully request that the Board consider requiring a **wall or buffer** between the two communities to preserve privacy and visual harmony. The proposed fence should at minimum have berm on the Cascades side
