Motion to Adopt Ordinance 21- __, Abandoning a Portion of a Twenty (20) foot Utility and Drainage Easement affecting Lot 14, Block 548, Port St. Lucie Section Thirteen, recorded in Plat Book 13, Page(s) 4, 4A to 4M, of the Public Records of St. Lucie County, Florida.

The enclosed Ordinance has been reviewed and revised by the City Attorney's Office with respect to the request for an abandonment of a portion of a twenty (20) foot wide Drainage and Utility Easement affecting Lot 14, Block 548, Port St. Lucie Section Thirteen, recorded in Plat Book 13, Page(s) 4, 4A to 4M, of the Public Records of St. Lucie County, Florida. The owners have submitted the Abandonment of Easement Application.

The request for the abandonment of a portion of a twenty (20) foot wide Drainage and Utility Easement affecting the subject property and all supporting documentation have been reviewed and approved as to legal form and sufficiency. As such, the attached Ordinance has been prepared for presentment to the City Council for review and approval.
