Motion to Adopt Ordinance 21- __, Abandoning a Portion of a Twenty (20) foot Utility and Drainage Easement affecting Lot 20, Block 1352, Port St. Lucie Section Eleven, recorded in Plat Book 12, Page(s) 51, 51A to 51E, of the Public Records of St. Lucie County, Florida.

The enclosed Ordinance has been reviewed and revised by the City Attorney's Office with respect to the request for an abandonment of a portion of a twenty (20) foot wide Drainage and Utility Easement affecting Lot 20, Block 1352, Port St. Lucie Section Eleven, recorded in Plat Book 12, Page(s) 51, 51A to 51E, of the Public Records of St. Lucie County, Florida. The owner has submitted the Abandonment of Easement Application.

The request for the abandonment of a portion of a twenty (20) foot wide Drainage and Utility Easement affecting the subject property and all supporting documentation have been reviewed and approved as to legal form and sufficiency.
