Motion to Adopt Ordinance 22-\_\_, Abandoning a Portion of a Twenty (20) foot wide Rear Utility and Drainage Easement affecting Lot 7, Block 1653, Port St. Lucie Section Five, recorded in Plat Book 12, Pages 15, 15A through 15E, of the Public Records of St. Lucie County, Florida.

The enclosed Ordinance has been reviewed and revised by the City Attorney's Office with respect to the request for an abandonment of a portion of a Twenty (20) foot wide rear Drainage and Utility Easement affecting Lot 7, Block 1653, Port St. Lucie Section Five, recorded in Plat Book 12, Pages 15, 15A through 15E, of the Public Records of St. Lucie County, Florida. The owners have submitted the Abandonment of Easement Application.
