RECITALS

WHEREAS, Contractor is a licensed Florida Company doing business in Florida; and Cul-De-Sacs, Guardrails, and Easement Mowing and Landscape Maintenance Services Citywide for the City of Port Saint Lucie as well as other tasks, more specifically described in this Contract; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is qualified, willing and able to provide the Work on the terms and conditions set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into this Contract with Contractor to perform the Work specified and, in an amount, agreed to below.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants herein name, the Parties agree as follows:

The Recitals set forth above are hereby incorporated into this Contract and made a part of hereof for reference.

SECTION I NOTICES

All notices or other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed duly given if sent by certified mail with return receipt request, email (with proof of confirmation) and addressed as follows unless written notice of a change of address is given pursuant to the provisions of this Contract.

SECTION II DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED

The specific work the Contractor agrees to perform all work pursuant to this Proposal #20190038, Cul-De-Sacs, Guardrails, and Easement Mowing and Landscape Maintenance Services Citywide, and all addendums which is incorporated herein by this reference.

SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of this work includes all labor, supervision, equipment, machinery, tools, materials, transportation, and other incidentals necessary to comply with the specifications set forth herein. The services shall include, but are not limited to, litter and debris removal, mowing, edging, weed removal, and pruning, of cul-de-sacs, guardrails and easements and other areas as specified. Contractor shall on all vehicles either have a placard or magnetic sign identifying their company name. Contractor personnel shall be in company uniform. The City's schedule for mowing reflects the direction the City has taken to standardize the level of service required throughout the City. It is the desire of the City to complete a regular service cycle over ten (10) consecutive work days.

The City reserves the right to modify the level of service due to environmental conditions, funding availability and/or the demands from the public. The Contractor will be required to maintain additional sites as growth continues throughout the City.

Precaution shall be exercised at all times for the protection of persons, including employees, and property.

The safety and consideration of convenience to the public is of paramount importance in executing the requirements of this bid. The bidder will not compromise public safety or allow any conditions that will inconvenience the public in the execution of works specified herein.

<u>Traffic Control</u> – The Contractor shall be responsible for traffic control during operations performed by the Contractor's personnel and/or subcontractors. Traffic control shall be in conformance with Federal Highway Administration, Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), latest edition and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Roadway and Traffic Design Standards, latest edition.

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<u>Service Area</u> – The City has an estimated 91 sites of landscape and mowing maintenance services citywide. Attachment A:

<u>Post Award Meeting</u> – Prior to commencing work, the Contractor, Contractor Supervisor, Project Manager, Environmental Services Manager, and Inspector shall conduct a field visit of all the work areas and identify the number of days to complete the work cycle and develop an annual and the first monthly work schedule.

<u>Monthly Meeting</u> - The Contractor shall meet with the Project Manager monthly, as determined by the Project Manager, to review contractual performance. Additionally, during this meeting, the Contractor and City Project Manager shall review and agree to the proposed monthly work schedule.

<u>Daily Work Schedule Submittal</u> – Contractor shall submit a daily work schedule via email, facsimile, or in person to the Project Manager or his designee by 8:00 a.m. each work day.

<u>Daily Checklist Submittal</u> - Contractor shall submit a signed, and dated checklist for the work completed via email, facsimile, or in person to the Project Manager or his designee by 8:00 a.m. the next work day.

<u>Work Hours</u> - Work shall be performed, by the Contractor, between 7:00am and dusk, Monday thru Friday. Work shall not be performed on Saturday, Sundays, or any City holiday unless specifically authorized, in writing, by the Project Manager or his designee.

<u>Litter/Debris Removal</u> – Prior to or during each service, the Contractor shall police the area and remove all litter/debris from the designated sites.

<u>Mowing and landscape Maintenance Services</u> – The following Citywide locations listed in Schedule A are twenty-four (24) times per year and/ or 2 times per month. The Contractor shall rake or otherwise remove all litter, trash, branches, all other accumulated debris prior to mowing.

Grass shall be mowed to a uniform minimum height of two inches (2") to three inches (3") for St. Augustine and Bahia Sod. Changes in height directed by the Project Manager or his designee, will be done at no additional charge. Grass clippings shall not be discharged into a drainage inlet or water bodies. Only mulching decks or rear discharge mowers are to be used on curbed section medians. The Contractor shall, immediately, after each mowing, remove all grass clippings or any accumulated debris from the mowed areas and those areas adjacent to those mowed to include and not limited to walkways, curbs, driveways, roadways, buildings, fences, vehicles, fences, signs etc.

All mowed areas are to be cut with a rotary type mower with sharp blades giving the mowed area a neat and clean cut. Mowing equipment shall have cutting blades maintained in optimal condition to ensure grass is evenly cut without a "tearing" and/or scalping effect, which would negatively affect growth, health and appearance of grass.

If sloped areas are too wet to be mowed, the areas may need to be cut with a weed-eater or bypassed. This will be at the discretion of the Project Manager or his designee. If rutting or damage to any

area occurs, the area may need to be graded and re-sodded, per the discretion of the Project Manager or his designee.

<u>Edging/Services</u> – Edging shall occur during each mowing service. Power equipment shall have manufacturer installed safety equipment and sharp blades. Power blade edging shall be performed along walk areas, curbs or any similar areas where string trimming will not provide the optimal appearance and/or effect. Soft edging shall be performed on St. Augustine turf only.

<u>Weeding Services</u> – Weeding shall occur during each mowing service. The contractor shall weed around, within or up to all posts, poles, planting beds, trees, ponds, curbs, walks, fence lines or any area that is not maintainable. The Contractor shall maintain at the end of each service cycle the service area shall be weed free.

In the event that weeds, or other undesirable vegetation become prevalent in planted beds, they are to be hand pulled. All cracks and joints in concrete, asphaltic concrete surfaces, and brickwork shall be cleaned by weed-eating, blown, and <u>then sprayed</u> with herbicide.

<u>Pruning Services</u> — Uniform edge cutting, shaping of landscape material shall be performed with acceptable equipment deemed to be in good working order Contractor shall trim/prune ground cover and shrubbery up to twelve (12) times per year.

All plant materials up to twelve feet (12') and lower in height shall be pruned/trimmed by the Contractor. Plantings within three hundred feet (300') of and intersection or turn lane shall be maintained at a height of eighteen inches (18") to twenty-four inches (24") as directed by the Project Manager or his designee. All dead lying branches or hanging dead palm fronds will be removed with each service.

<u>Diseased or Damaged Plant Material</u> - Any sick, diseased or damaged plant or tree material shall be punctually reported to the Project Manager or his designee.

<u>Damage During Performance of Work</u> - Damage to trees, plants, any components of the irrigation system, buildings, structures, parked vehicles or other property of the City or the public which occurs during the performance of contracted services, shall be reported immediately by the Contractor's Staff to the Public Works Project Manager, or his designee. A written incident report shall be completed and submitted by the Contractor within twenty-four (24) hours of the event. The Project Manager or his designee will supply report forms for the Contractors use in reporting any damages. Damages during times that City Offices are closed shall be reported to the Police Department Duty Officer with a request to call the Project Manager or their designee, as necessary.

If applicable, the Public Works Project Manager or his designee, shall determine the cost of necessary repairs or replacement and advise the Contractor in writing. Where damages are involved the Public Works Project Manager and the Contractor shall mutually agree on an acceptable cost. The Contractor shall be afforded the opportunity to have repairs made or provide replacement as approved by the City or shall punctually issue reimbursement within a time frame approved by the City. All such matters shall be put forth in writing and signed by both parties.

<u>Cleanup</u> - Parking lots, driveways, walks, and any other similar areas present on the grounds shall be cleaned of cuttings and debris by use of power and/or hand equipment. Such cuttings

as may require cleanup shall be removed from the site by the Contractor on the date of service. No cuttings dispensed from mower shall be blown into plant beds. trash, cigarette butts, litter, or debris shall be removed prior to commencing work.

<u>Location:</u> All work required by this specification will be performed within the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida.

SECTION III TIME OF PERFORMANCE

The Contract Period will start on May 2, 2019 and will extend for three (3) years ending on May 2, 2022. The Contractor will be required to commence work under this Contract within ten (10) calendar days after the start date identified in this Contract. In the event all work required in the bid specifications has not been completed by the specified end of the initial term date, the Contractor agrees to provide work at no additional cost as authorized by the Project Manager, or their designee, until all work specified in the bid specifications has been rendered.

Written requests shall be submitted to the City for consideration of extension of completion time due to strikes, unavailable materials, or other similar causes over which the Contractor feels he has no control. Requests for time extensions shall be submitted immediately but in no event more than two (2) weeks upon occurrence of conditions, which, in the opinion of the Contractor, warrant such an extension with reasons clearly stated and a detailed explanation given as to why the delays are considered to be beyond the Contractor's control.

SECTION IV RENEWAL OPTION

In the event Contractor is to provide the identical services required in this Contract for the following one (1) additional, two (2) year periods, the City, without additional bidding or negotiation, may, with the mutual agreement of the Contractor, extend this Contract for the additional term.

The Contractor must request such an adjustment in writing no later than sixty (60) days prior to the renewal date and must include in the written request documentation that the Contractor has incurred bona fide cost increases in providing services under this Contract during the period in which the request is made. The City will not allow contract adjustments, up or down, to exceed five (5%) percent combined total in any one period. Any increase will be effective on the contract renewal date.

Price Adjustment will be based on the annual index (Un-Adjusted) using the published figures one month prior to the renewal date. The price adjustment will be calculated on the simple percentage method.

**This would be the increase percentage to the unit price of the contract. If City agrees that said services are required and the negotiated cost is acceptable, then the City may extend this Contract for the additional term.

SECTION V COMPENSATION

The total amount to be paid by the City to the Contractor is on a per unit fixed price basis as listed below in Schedule A for Cul-De-Sacs, Guardrails and Easement Mowing and Landscape Maintenance Services Citywide. A one-time ten-dollar (\$10.00) payment for the Indemnification Fee as provided in Section VIII herein.

Invoices for services shall be submitted once a month, by the tenth (10th) day of each month, and payments shall be made in forty-five (45) days after invoice unless Contractor has chosen to take advantage of the Purchasing Card Program, which guarantees payment within several days. Payments shall be made net forty-five (45) calendar days of receipt of Contractor's valid invoice, provided that the invoice is accompanied by adequate supporting documentation, including any necessary partial release of liens, and is approved by the Project Manager, or their designee, as required under Section XV of the Contract.

All invoices and correspondence relative to this Contract must contain the following:

- Purchase Order number or VISA number
- Contract number
- Detail of items with prices that correspond to the Contract
- Service Area
- Date of Service
- Unique invoice number
- Partial or final release of liens

The Contractor shall not be paid additional compensation for any loss or damage, arising out of the nature of the work, from the action of the elements, or from any delay or unforeseen obstruction or difficulties encountered in the performance of the work, or for any expenses incurred by or in consequence of the suspension or discontinuance of the work.

SECTION VI WORK CHANGES

The City reserves the right to order work changes in the nature of additions, deletions or modifications without invalidating the Contract, and agrees to make corresponding adjustments in the Contract price and time for completion. All changes will be authorized by a written change order

signed by the City Manager or designee as representing the City. Work shall be changed, and the Contract price and completion time shall be modified only as set out in the written change order. Any adjustment in the Contract price resulting in a credit or a charge to the City shall be determined by mutual Contract of the parties.

SECTION VII CONFORMANCE WITH PROPOSAL

It is understood that the materials and/or work required herein are in accordance with the proposal made by the Contractor pursuant to the Request for Proposal and all addendums and Specifications on file in the Procurement Management Department of the City. All documents submitted by the Contractor in relation to said proposal, and all documents promulgated by the City for inviting proposals are, by reference, made a part hereof as if set forth herein in full.

SECTION VIII INDEMNIFICATION HOLD HARMLESS

Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless, the City, its officers, agents, and employees from, and against any and all claims, actions, liabilities, losses and expenses including, but not limited to, attorney's fees for personal, economic or bodily injury, wrongful death, loss of or damage to property, at law or in equity, which may arise or may be alleged to have risen from the negligent acts, errors, omissions or other wrongful conduct of Contractor, agents, laborers, subcontractors or other personnel entity acting under Contractor's control in connection with the Contractor's performance of services under this Contract and to that extent Contractor shall pay such claims and losses and shall pay all such costs and judgments which may issue from any lawsuit arising from such claims and losses including wrongful termination or allegations of discrimination or harassment, and shall pay all costs and attorney's fees expended by the City in defense of such claims and losses including appeals. That the aforesaid hold-harmless Contract by Contractor shall apply to all damages and claims for damages of every kind suffered, or alleged to have been suffered, by reason of any of the aforesaid operations of Contractor or any agent laborers, subcontractors or employee of Contractor regardless of whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to be applicable to any of such damages or claims for damages. Contractor shall be held responsible for any violation of laws, rules, regulations or ordinances affecting in any way the conduct of all persons engaged in or the materials or methods used by Contractor on the Work. Contractor shall give all notices and comply with all laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and orders of any public authority bearing on the performance of the Work under this Contract. Contractor shall secure all permits, fees, licenses, and inspections necessary for the execution of the Work, and upon termination of this Contract for any reason, Contractor shall transfer such permits, if any, and if allowed by law, to the City. As consideration for this indemnity provision the Contractor shall be paid the one-time sum of ten dollars (\$10.00), which will be added to the contract price, and paid prior to commencement of work. This indemnification shall survive the termination of this Contract.

SECTION IX SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY

Nothing contained in this Contract shall be deemed or otherwise interpreted as waiving the City's sovereign immunity protections existing under the laws of the State of Florida, or as increasing the limits of liability as set forth in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

SECTION X INSURANCE

The Contractor shall, on a primary basis and at its sole expense, agree to maintain in full force and effect at all times during the life of this Contract, insurance coverage, limits, including endorsements, as described herein. The requirements contained herein, as well as City's review or acceptance of insurance maintained by Contractor are not intended to and shall not in any manner limit or qualify the liabilities and obligations assumed by Contractor under the Contract.

The parties agree and recognize that it is not the intent of the City of Port St. Lucie that any insurance policy/coverage that it may obtain pursuant to any provision of this Contract will provide insurance coverage to any entity, corporation, business, person, or organization, other than the City of Port St. Lucie and the City shall not be obligated to provide any insurance coverage other than for the City of Port St. Lucie or extend its sovereign immunity pursuant to Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, under its self-insured program. Any provision contained herein to the contrary shall be considered void and unenforceable by any party. This provision does not apply to any obligation imposed on any other party to obtain insurance coverage for this project, any obligation to name the City of Port St. Lucie as an additional insured under any other insurance policy, or otherwise protect the interests of the City of Port St. Lucie as specified in this Contract.

- 1. Workers' Compensation Insurance & Employer's Liability: The Contractor shall agree to maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance & Employers' Liability in accordance with Section 440, Florida Statutes. Employers' Liability and must include limits of at least \$100,000.00 each accident, \$100,000.00 each disease/employee, \$500,000.00 each disease/maximum. A Waiver of Subrogation endorsement shall be provided. Coverage shall apply on a primary basis. Should scope of work performed by Contractor qualify its employee for benefits under Federal Workers' Compensation Statute (example, U.S. Longshore & Harbor Workers Act or Merchant Marine Act), proof of appropriate Federal Act coverage must be provided.
- 2. <u>Commercial General Liability Insurance</u>: The Contractor shall agree to maintain Commercial General Liability insurance issued under an Occurrence form basis, including Contractual liability, to cover the hold harmless agreement set forth herein, with limits of not less than:

Each occurrence \$1,000,000
Personal/advertising injury \$1,000,000
Products/completed operations aggregate \$2,000,000
General aggregate \$2,000,000
Fire damage \$100,000 any 1 fire

Medical expense \$10,000 any 1 person

3. Additional Insured: An Additional Insured endorsement must be attached to the certificate of insurance (should be ISO CG2026) under the General Liability policy. Coverage is to be written on an occurrence form basis and shall apply as primary. A per project aggregate limit endorsement should be attached. Defense costs are to be in addition to the limit of liability. A waiver of subrogation shall be provided in favor of the City. Coverage shall include pesticide and herbicide application coverage or other job site, sudden and accidental pollution coverage including while in transit, as applicable to this type of

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operation. Coverage for the hazards of explosion, collapse and underground property damage (XCU) must also be included when applicable to the work performed. No exclusion for mold, silica or respirable dust or bodily injury/property damage arising out of heat, smoke, fumes, or hostile fire shall apply. Coverage shall extend to independent Contractors and fellow employees. Contractual Liability is to be included. Coverage is to include a cross liability or severability of interest's provision as provided under the standard ISO form separation of insurer's clause.

Except as to Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability, said Certificate(s) and policies shall clearly state that coverage required by the Contract has been endorsed to include the City of Port St. Lucie, a municipality of the State of Florida, its officers, agents and employees as Additional Insured added to its Commercial General Liability policy and Business Auto policy. The name for the Additional Insured endorsement issued by the insurer shall read "City of Port St. Lucie, a municipality of the State of Florida, its officers, employees and agents and shall include Contract #20190038 - Cul-De-Sacs, Guardrails and Easements Mowing and Landscaping Maintenance Services Citywide shall be listed as additionally insured.". The Policy shall be specifically endorsed to provide thirty (30) day written notice to the City prior to any adverse changes, cancellation. or non-renewal of coverage thereunder. In the event that the statutory liability of the City is amended during the term of this Contract to exceed the above limits, the Contractor shall be required, upon thirty (30) days written notice by the City, to provide coverage at least equal to the amended statutory limit of liability of the City. Copies of the Additional Insured endorsements including Completed Operations coverage shall be attached to the Certificate of Insurance. All independent contractors and subcontractors utilized in this project shall furnish a Certificate of Insurance to the City in accordance with the same requirements set forth herein.

- 4. <u>Automobile Liability Insurance:</u> The Contractor shall agree to maintain Business Automobile Liability at a limit of liability not less than \$1,000,000.00 each accident covering any auto, owned, non-owned and hired automobiles. In the event, the Contractor does not own any automobiles; the Business Auto Liability requirement shall be amended allowing Contractor to agree to maintain only Hired & Non-Owned Auto Liability. This amended requirement may be satisfied by way of endorsement to the Commercial General Liability, or separate Business Auto Coverage form. Certificate holder must be listed as additional insured. A waiver of subrogation shall be provided. Coverage shall apply on a primary basis.
- 5. <u>Waiver of Subrogation</u>: The Contractor shall agree by entering into this Contract to a Waiver of Subrogation for each required policy. When required by the insurer or should a policy condition not permit an Insured to enter into a pre-loss Contract to waive subrogation without an endorsement then Contractor shall agree to notify the insurer and request the policy be endorsed with a Waiver of Transfer of Rights of Recovery Against Others, or its equivalent. This Waiver of Subrogation requirement shall not apply to any policy where a condition to the policy specifically prohibits such an endorsement, or voids coverage should Contractor enter into such a Contract on a pre-loss basis.
- 6. <u>Deductibles:</u> All deductible amounts shall be paid for and be the responsibility of the Contractor for any and all claims under this Contract. Where an SIR or deductible exceeds

\$5,000, the City of Port St. Lucie reserves the right, but not obligation, to review and request a copy of the bidder's most recent annual report or audited financial statement.

It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to ensure that all independent contractors and/or subcontractors comply with the same insurance requirements referenced above.

The Contractor may satisfy the minimum limits required above for either Commercial General Liability, Business Auto Liability, and Employers' Liability coverage under Umbrella or Excess Liability. The Umbrella or Excess Liability shall have an Aggregate limit not less than the highest "Each Occurrence" limit for either Commercial General Liability, Business Auto Liability, or Employers' Liability. When required by the insurer, or when Umbrella or Excess Liability is written on Non-Follow Form," the City shall be endorsed as an "Additional Insured."

The City, by and through its Risk Management Department, reserves the right, but not obligation, to review, modify, reject, or accept any required policies of insurance including limits, coverages or endorsements, herein from time to time throughout the term of this contract. All insurance carriers must have an AM Best rating of at least A:VII or better.

A failure on the part of the contractor to execute the contract and/or punctually deliver the required insurance, and other documentation may be cause for annulment of the award.

Payment & Performance Bonds: The Contractor shall furnish an acceptable Performance and Payment Bond complying with the statutory requirements set forth in Section 255.05, Florida Statutes, in the amount of ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars. A fully authorized Surety licensed by the State of Florida shall execute the Performance and Payment Bond. The Performance and Payment Bond shall remain in full force and effect throughout the life of the Contract.

SECTION XI ACTS OF GOD

The Contractor shall be responsible for all preparation of the site for Acts of God, including but not limited to; earthquake, flood, tropical storm, hurricane or other cataclysmic phenomenon of nature, rain, wind or other natural phenomenon of normal intensity, including extreme rainfall. No reparation shall be made to the Contractor for damages to the Work resulting from these Acts. The City is not responsible for any costs associated with pre or post preparations for any Acts of God

Emergencies - In the event of emergencies affecting the safety of persons, the work, or property, at the site or adjacent thereto, the Contractor(s), or his designee, without special instruction or authorization from the City, is obligated to act to prevent threatened damage, injury or loss. In the event such actions are taken, the Contractor(s) shall promptly give to the City written notice and contact immediately by phone, of any significant changes in work or deviations from the Contract documents caused thereby, and if such action is deemed appropriate by the City a written authorization signed by the City covering the approved changes and deviations will be issued.

SECTION XII PROHIBITION AGAINST FILING OR MAINTAINING LIENS AND SUITS

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Subject to the laws of the State of Florida and of the United States, neither Contractor nor any sub consultant supplier of materials, laborer or other person shall file or maintain any lien for labor or materials delivered in the performance of this Contract against the City. The right to maintain such lien for any or all of the above parties is hereby expressly waived.

SECTION XIII COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Contractor shall give all notices required by and shall otherwise comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, and codes and shall, at his own expense, secure and pay the fees and charges for all permits required for the performance of the Contract. All materials furnished and works done are to comply with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations. Contractor with § 119.0701, Fla. Stat. (2016). The Contractor and Subcontractor are to allow public access to all documents, papers, letters, or other material made or received by the Contractor in conjunction with this Contract, unless the records are exempt from Art. I, § 24(a), Fla. Const. and § 119.07(1)(a), Fla. Stat. (2016). Pursuant to § 119.10(2)(a), Fla. Stat. (2016), any person who willfully and knowingly violates any of the provisions of Ch. 119, Laws of Fla., commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in § 775.082 and § 775.083 Fla. Stat. (2016).

RECORDS

The City of Port St. Lucie is a public agency subject to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. The Contractor shall comply with Florida's Public Records Law. CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR COMPLIANCE WITH CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES. Pursuant to Section 119.0701, F.S.

Contractor agrees to comply with all public records laws, specifically to:

Keep and maintain public records required by the City in order to perform the service;

- 1. The timeframes and classifications for records retention requirements must be in accordance with the General Records Schedule GS1-SL for State and Local Government Agencies. (See http://dos.dos.state.fl.us/library-archives/records-management/general-records-schedules/).
- 2. During the term of the contract, the Contractor shall maintain all books, reports and records in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices and standards for records directly related to this contract. The form of all records and reports shall be subject to the approval of the City.
- 3. Records include all documents, papers, letters, maps, books, tapes, photographs, films, sound recordings, data processing software, or other material, regardless of the physical form, characteristics, or means of transmission, made or received pursuant to law or ordinance or in connection with the transaction of official business with the City. Contractor's records under this Contract include but are not limited to, supplier/subcontractor invoices and contracts, project documents, meeting notes, emails and all other documentation generated during this Agreement.
- 4. The Contractor agrees to make available to the City, during normal business hours all books of account, reports and records relating to this contract.

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5. A Contractor who fails to provide the public records to the City within a reasonable time may also be subject to penalties under Section 119.10, Florida Statutes.

Upon request from the City's custodian of public records, provide the public agency with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in this chapter or as otherwise provided by law.

Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the contractor does not transfer the records to the City.

Upon completion of the contract, transfer, at no cost to the City, all public records in possession of the Contractor, or keep and maintain public records required by the City to perform the service. If the Contractor transfers all public records to the City upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Contractor keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the City, upon request from the City's custodian of public records in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the City.

SECTION XIV CLEANING UP

The Contractor shall, during the performance of this Contract, remove and properly dispose of resulting dirt and debris, and keep the work area reasonably clear. Upon completion of the work, the Contractor shall remove all of Contractors' equipment and all excess materials, and put the work area in a neat, clean, sanitary and safe condition.

SECTION XV INSPECTION AND CORRECTION OF DEFECTS

In order to determine whether the required material has been delivered or the required work performed in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Contract documents, the Project Manager shall make inspection as soon as practicable after receipt from the Contractor of a Notice of Performance or delivery ticket. If such inspection shows that the required material has been

delivered and required work performed in accordance with terms and conditions of the Contract documents and that the material and work is entirely satisfactory, the Project Manager shall approve the invoice when it is received. Thereafter the Contractor shall be entitled to payment, as described in Section VI. If, on such inspection the Project Manager is not satisfied, he shall as promptly as practicable inform the parties hereto of the specific respects in which his findings are not favorable. The Contractor shall then be afforded an opportunity to correct the deficiencies so pointed out at no additional charge to the City, and otherwise on terms and conditions specified by the Project Manager. Such examination, inspection, or tests made by the Project Manager, shall not relieve Contractor of its responsibility to remedy any deviation, deficiency, or defect.

<u>Authority</u> - The Contractor(s) are hereby informed that City inspectors are not authorized to alter, revoke, enlarge, or relax the provisions of these specifications. They are not authorized to approve or accept any portion of the completed work, or instructions contrary to the specifications. An inspector is placed on the project (or sent to the location of materials) to inspect materials being used in the work and to observe the manner in which the work is being performed and to report the progress of the work to the City. The inspector shall have the authority to reject defective materials or suspend any work that is being improperly done subject to the final decision of the City.

<u>Notification</u> - The Contractor(s) shall be responsible to give twenty-four (24) hour notification to the City, when field observations are required.

<u>Defective Work</u> - All work and/or materials not meeting the requirements of these specifications shall be deemed as defective by the City, and all such work and/or material, whether in place or not, shall be removed immediately from the site of the work. All rejected materials that have been corrected shall not be used until the City has issued written approval to the Contractor(s). Without unnecessary delay and without any additional cost to the City, all work that has been rejected shall be remedied or removed and replaced in a manner acceptable to the City. If the Contractor(s) fails to promptly remove and properly dispose of rejected materials and/or work then replaces same immediately after being notified to do so, the City, may employ labor to remove and replace such defective work and/or materials. All charges for replacement of defective materials and/or work shall be charged to the Contractor(s) and may be deducted from any moneys due to the Contractor(s) or his Surety.

<u>Repair or Replacement</u> – Should any defect appear during this period, the Contractor shall, at their expense, have repaired or replaced such item upon receipt of written notice from the City of said defect.

Said repair or replacement must be accomplished within fourteen (14) calendar days after receipt of notification from the City of the defect.

<u>Deductions</u> - In the event the City deems it expedient to perform work which has not been done by the Contractor as required by these Specifications, or to correct work which has been improperly and/or inadequately performed by the Contractor as required in these Specifications, all expenses thus incurred by the City, at the City's option, will be invoiced to the Contractor and/or deducted from payments due to the Contractor. Deductions thus made will not excuse the Contractor from other conditions contained in the Contract.

SECTION XVI ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

In the event of any conflict between the terms and conditions, appearing on any purchase order issued relative to this Contract, and those contained in this Contract and the Specifications herein referenced, the terms of this Contract and Specifications herein referenced shall apply.

<u>City's Public Relations Image</u> – The Contractor's personnel shall at all times handle complaints and any public contact with due regard to the City's relationship with the public. Any personnel in the employ of the Contractor involved in the execution of work that is deemed to be conducting him/her self in an unacceptable manner shall be removed from the project at the request of the City Manager.

<u>Dress Code</u> – All personnel in the employ of the Contractor(s) shall be appropriately attired. Employees engaged in the course of work shall wear company uniforms neat and clean in appearance, readily identifiable to all City employees and the public. All FDOT dress requirements apply. No tee shirts with obscene pictures or writings will be allowed. Swimsuits, tank tops, shorts and sandals are also prohibited. Safety toed shoes shall be worn at all times. Company uniform may be T-shirts with the company name on the t-shirt. Contractors personnel must wear reflective vest at all times during the course of the work.

Patent Fees, Royalties, and Licenses - If the Contractor requires or desires to use any design, trademark, device, material or process covered by letters of patent or copyright, the Contractor and his surety shall indemnify and hold harmless the City from any and all claims for infringement in connection with the work agreed to be performed. The Contractor shall indemnify the City from any cost, expense, royalty or damage which the City may be obligated to pay by reason of any infringement at any time during the prosecution of or after completion of the work.

<u>Cooperative Purchasing Agreement</u> - This bid may be expanded to include other governmental agencies provided a cooperative Purchasing Agreement exists or an Inter-local Agreement for joint purchasing exists between the City and other public agencies. The Contractors may agree to allow other public agencies to contract with them for the same items at the same terms and conditions as this bid, during the period of time that this bid is in effect. Each political entity will be responsible for execution of its own requirements with the Contractor.

<u>Discrepancies</u> – If, in the course of performing work resulting from an award under this specification, the Contractor finds any discrepancy between the area defined in these specifications and the actual area where work is being performed, the Contractor shall discontinue work on the subject area and inform the Contract Supervisor of the discrepancy. The Contractor shall thereafter proceed as authorized by the Contract Supervisor who will document any modification to these specifications that was authorized in writing as soon as possible.

<u>Permission to Use</u> – The Contractor(s) shall permit any portion of the new work, which is in suitable condition, to be used by the City for the purpose for which it was intended, provided such use does not hinder or make more expensive the work still to be done by the selected Contractor(s).

<u>Contractual Relations</u> - The Contractor(s) are advised that nothing contained in the contract or specifications shall create any contractual relations between the City and subcontractors of the Contractor.

<u>Labor and Equipment</u> – The Contractor(s) shall utilize experienced personnel who are thoroughly capable of performing the work assigned to them. The Contractor(s) shall utilize proper equipment in good repair to perform assigned work. Failure on the part of the Contractor(s) to furnish such labor or equipment shall be sufficient cause for annulment of any award resulting from these specifications.

<u>Water Resources</u> – The Contractor shall not discharge without permit into waters of lakes, rivers, canals, waterways and ditches, any fuel, oils, bitumens, garbage, sewage, or other materials which may be harmful to fish, wildlife, or vegetation, or that may be detrimental to outdoor recreation. The Contractor shall be responsible for investigating and complying with all applicable Federal, State and local laws and regulations governing pollution of waters. All work under this Contract shall be performed in such a manner that objectionable conditions will not be created in waters through or adjacent to the project areas.

<u>Sanitary Conditions</u> – The Contractor(s) shall be responsible to provide and maintain in a neat and sanitary condition such accommodations for the use of employees as may be necessary to comply with the regulations of the County Board of Health or other bodies having jurisdiction. Contractor(s) shall commit no public nuisance.

<u>Access to Work</u> – The Contractor(s) shall be responsible to permit the City, its inspectors, and other authorized representatives of the City to have access to all parts of the work, and to all materials intended for use in the work, and to all factories where such materials are manufactured, at all times. The above designated City personnel shall be permitted during said access to remove materials and make such inspections, as they deem necessary. Materials submitted for approval will be inspected and passed upon as promptly as practical as will work in process. However, failure to reject defective work at the time it is done and/or failure to reject materials shall in no way prevent rejection at any time prior to final acceptance of the work authorized by the City.

<u>Foreman or Superintendent and Workmen</u> — The Contractor(s) shall at all times during progress of the work, have on site a competent foreman or superintendent with authority to act for him and to cooperate with the City. The Contractor(s) shall provide competent, careful and reliable workmen engaged on special work, or skilled work, such as concrete bases, pavements, or structures, or in any trade, with sufficient experience in such work to perform it properly and satisfactorily and to operate the equipment involved. The Contractor shall provide workmen that shall make due and proper effort to execute the work in the manner prescribed in the Contract Documents. The Contractor will provide the City the phone number of the Foreman or Superintendent that is on site at all times.

It is prohibited as a conflict of interest for a Contractor to subcontract with a consultant to perform Contractor Quality Control when the consultant is under contract with the City to perform work on any project described in the Contractor's contract with the City. Prior to approving a consultant for Contractor Quality Control, the Contractor shall submit to the City a certificate from the proposed consultant certifying that no conflict of interest exists.

Final

<u>Adjustments</u> – The Contractor(s) shall be responsible to arrange with utility companies for any adjustment necessary. The Contractor(s) shall also be responsible to identify and avoid damage to all utilities (publicly and privately owned) within the area where work is being performed.

<u>Damages</u> – The Contractor(s) shall be responsible for the charge and care of all work from damage by the elements or from any cause whatsoever until the City, confirms in writing to the Contractor(s) that said work is, "complete" and/or "accepted".

<u>Damage to Property</u> – The Contractor shall preserve from damage all property along the line of work, or which is in the vicinity of or is in any way affected by the work, the removal, or destruction of which is not called for by the plans. This applies to public and private property, public and private utilities, trees, shrubs, crops, signs, monuments, fences, guardrail, pipe and underground structures, public highways, etc. Whenever such property is damaged due to the activities of the Contractor, it shall be immediately restored to a condition equal to or better than existing before such damage or injury was done by the Contractor, and at the Contractor expense. The Contractor's special attention is directed to protection of any geodetic monument, horizontal, vertical or property corner, located within the limits of construction.

National Geodetic Vertical Datum 1929 (NGVD '29) or North American Vertical Datum 1988 (NAVD '88) monuments shall be protected. If in danger of damage, notify:

SECTION XVII LICENSING

Contractor warrants that he possesses all licenses and certificates necessary to perform required work and is not in violation of any laws. Contractor warrants that his license and certificates are current and will be maintained throughout the duration of the Contract.

SECTION XVIII SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Precaution shall be exercised at all times for the protection of persons, including employees, members of the public and property. The safety provisions of all applicable laws and building and construction codes shall be observed.

<u>Safety Data Sheets (SDS)</u> - The Contractor shall provide SDS's and description literature for each chemical/compound/mixture used in the performance of the Contract to the City before the commencement of any work. All SDS's shall be of the latest version and comply with 29 CFR§ 1910.1200. Hazardous products shall not be used except with prior approval of the City and must be disposed of properly by the Contractor in accordance with U.S. Environmental Protection Agency 40 CFR§ 260-265. The Contractor shall maintain and have readily accessible on-site a complete SDS book of all chemicals, compounds/mixtures used in the execution of the contract. No herbicide is permissible in the contract.

<u>Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)</u> - All personnel are required to wear PPE in the process of the work including eye protection, hearing protection, respiratory protection as necessary, gloves, approved safety boots with steel or composite toes and any other PPE as necessary for the work. Contractors personnel must wear reflective vest at all times during the course of the work.

<u>Safety Precautions</u> - The Contractor shall erect and maintain all necessary safeguards for the protection of the Contractor's employees and subcontractors, City personnel, and the general public; including, but not limited to, posting danger signs, coned off vehicles, arrow boards and other warnings against hazards as is prudent and/or required by law to protect the public interest. The Contractor's employees shall wear company uniforms, safety vests, safety boots and safety glasses. All damage, injury or loss to persons and/or property caused, directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, by the Contractor's employees, or subcontractor(s), or anyone directly or indirectly employed by said parties shall be remedied by the Contractor(s). All vehicles used to transport equipment must be coned off when left on the side of the roadway.

<u>Equipment Safety</u> – Equipment used for the work contained in this contract shall be periodically inspected and maintained to ensure proper function and safety. Equipment used to transport litter, trimmings, leaves and trash, etc., shall be constructed in a manner to prevent such items being misplaced along the roadside.

<u>Vehicle Lighting and Special Equipment</u> - The Contractor shall have beacon lights and or slow-moving signs on all vehicles, specialized equipment and mowing equipment at all times fully operational. The Contractor shall use amber flashing lights on according to the State of Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) regulations. These lights shall be used only when performing the scope of work in this contract and shall not be used when traveling to and from the job sites.

<u>OSHA Compliance</u> – The Contractor shall agree that the products furnished, and application methods will comply with applicable provisions of the Williams-Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) of 1970. These requirements shall include all primary and refresher training mandated under the OSHA guidelines

SECTION XIX ASSIGNMENT

Contractor shall not delegate, assign or subcontract any part of the work under this Contract or assign any monies due him hereunder without first obtaining the written consent of the City.

SECTION XX TERMINATION, DELAYS AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

- A. Termination for Breach of Contract. If the Contractor refuses or fails to deliver material as required and/or prosecute the work with such diligence as will insure its completion within the time specified in this Contract, the City by written notice to the Contractor, may terminate Contractor's rights to proceed. Upon such termination, the City may take over the work and prosecute the same to completion, by Contract or otherwise, and the Contractor and his sureties shall be liable to the City for any additional cost incurred by it in its completion of the work. The City may also in event of termination obtain undelivered materials, by Contract or otherwise, and the Contractor and his sureties shall be liable to the City for any additional cost incurred for such material. Contractor and his sureties shall also be liable to the City for liquidated damages for any delay in the completion of the work as provided below. If the Contractor's right to proceed is so terminated, the City may take possession of and utilize in completing the work such materials, tools, equipment and facilities as may be on the site of the work and necessary therefore.
- B. Liquidated Damages for Delays. If material is not provided or work is not completed within the time stipulated in this Contract, including any extensions of time for excusable delays as herein provided, the Contractor shall provide to the City two hundred (\$200.00) dollars as fixed, agreed and liquidated damages for each calendar day of delay until the work is completed. The Contractor and his sureties shall be jointly and severally liable to the City for the amount thereof.
- C. Excusable Delays. The right of the Contractor to proceed shall not be terminated nor shall the Contractor be charged with liquidated damages for any delays in the completion of the work or delivery of materials due to: (1) any acts of the Federal Government, including controls or restrictions or requisitioning of materials, equipment, tools or labor by reason of war, national defense or any other national emergency, (2) any adverse acts of the City, (3) causes not reasonably foreseeable by the parties at the time of the execution of the Contract that are beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor, including but not restricted to, acts of God, acts of the public enemy, acts of another Contractor in the performance of some other Contract with the City, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine, restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes and weather of unusual severity such as hurricanes, tornadoes, cyclones and other extreme weather conditions, and (4) any delay of any Subcontractor occasioned by any of the above mentioned causes. However, the Contractor must promptly notify the City in writing within two (2) calendar days of the cause of delay. If, on the basis of the facts and the terms of this Contract, the delay is properly excusable the City shall extend the time for completing the work for a period of time commensurate with the period of excusable delay.
- D. Termination by the City. The City may terminate this Contract with or without cause by giving the Contractor thirty (30) calendar day notice in writing. Upon delivery of said notice the Contractor shall discontinue all services in connection with the performance of this Contract and shall proceed to cancel promptly all related existing third party Contracts. Termination of the Contract by the City

pursuant to this paragraph shall terminate all of the City's obligations hereunder and no charges, penalties or other costs shall be due Contractor except for work timely completed.

E. Termination for Insolvency. The City also reserves the right to terminate the remaining services to be performed in the event CONTRACTOR NAME is placed either in voluntary or involuntary bankruptcy or makes any assignment for the benefit of creditors.

SECTION XXI LAW AND VENUE

This Contract is to be construed as though made in and to be performed in the State of Florida and is to be governed by the laws of Florida in all respects without reference to the laws of any other state or nation. The venue of any action taken pursuant to this Contract shall be in St. Lucie County, Florida.

SECTION XXII REIMBURSEMENT FOR INSPECTION

The Contractor agrees to reimburse the City for any expenditures incurred by the City in the process of testing materials supplied by the Contractor against the specifications under which said materials were procured, if said materials prove to be defective, improperly applied, and/or in other manners not in compliance with specifications. Expenditures as defined herein shall include, but not be limited to, the replacement value of materials destroyed in testing, the cost paid by the City to testing laboratories and other entities utilized to provide tests, and the value of labor and materials expended by the City in the process of conducting the testing. Reimbursement of charges as specified herein shall not relieve the Contractor from other remedies provided in the Contract.

SECTION XIII APPROPRIATION APPROVAL

The Contractor acknowledges that the City of Port St Lucie's performance and obligation to pay under this Contract is contingent upon an annual appropriation by the City Council. The Contractor agrees that, in the event such appropriation is not forthcoming, this Contract may be terminated by the City and that no charges, penalties or other costs shall be assessed.

SECTION XXIV ATTORNEY'S FEES

If this matter is placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or in the event suit or action is instituted by the City to enforce any of the terms or conditions of the Contract, Contractor shall pay to the City, in such suit or action in both trial court and appellate court, the City's costs, and reasonable attorney's fees for the anticipated cost of collection and judgment enforcement.

SECTION XXV CODE OF ETHICS

Contractor warrants and represents that its employees will abide by any applicable provisions of the State of Florida Code of Ethics in Chapter 112.311 et seq., Florida Statutes, and Code of Ethics Ordinances in Section 9.14 of the City of Port St. Lucie Code.

SECTION XXVI CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The City hereby acknowledges that the Contractor may be performing professional services for private developers within the Treasure Coast area. Should a conflict of interest arise between providing services to the City and/or other clients, the Contractor shall terminate its relationship with the other client to resolve the conflict of interest. The City Manager shall determine whether a conflict of interest exists. At the time of each Project Proposal the Contractor shall disclose all of its Treasure Coast clients and related Scope of Work.

SECTION XXVII PROHIBITION AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES

The Contractor warrants that he or she has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Contractor to solicit or secure this Contract and that he or she has not paid or agreed to pay any person, company, corporation, individual, or firm, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Contractor any fee, commission, percentage, gift, or other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Contract.

SECTION XXVIII COMPLIANCE WITH LAW, RULES & REGULATIONS

Contractor shall be held responsible for any violation of laws, rules, regulations or ordinances affecting in any way the conduct of all persons engaged in or the materials or methods used by it, on the Work. Contractor shall give all notices and comply with all laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and orders of any public authority bearing on the performance of the Work under this Contract. Contractor shall secure all permits, fees, licenses, and inspections necessary for the execution of the Work, and upon termination of this Contract for any reason, Contractor shall transfer such permits, if any, and if allowed by law, to the City.

SECTION XXIX POLICY OF NON-DISCRIMINATION

Contractor shall not discriminate against any person in its operations, activities or delivery of services under this Contract. Contractor shall affirmatively comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state and local equal employment laws and shall not engage in or commit any discriminatory practice against any person based on race, age, religion, color, gender, sexual orientation, national origin, marital status, physical or mental disability, political affiliation or any other factor which cannot be lawfully used as a basis for service delivery.

SECTION XXX SEVERABILITY

The Parties to this Contract expressly agree that it is not their intention to violate any public policy, statutory or common law rules, regulations, or decisions of any governmental or regulatory body. If any provision of this Contract is judicially or administratively interpreted or construed as being in violation of any such policy, rule, regulation, or decision, the provision, sections, sentence, word, clause, or combination thereof causing such violation will be inoperative (and in lieu thereof there

will be inserted such provision, section, sentence, word, clause, or combination thereof as may be valid and consistent with the intent of the Parties under this Contract) and the remainder of this Contract, as amended, will remain binding upon the Parties, unless the inoperative provision would cause enforcement of the remainder of this Contract to be inequitable under the circumstances.

SECTION XXXI ENTIRE AGREEMENT

The written terms and provisions of this Contract shall supersede any and all prior verbal or written statements of any official or other representative of the City. Such statements shall not be effective or be construed as entering into, or forming a part of, or altering in any manner whatsoever, this Contract or Contract documents.

Rolling Stores

If a covered "auto" is a rolling store, "bodily injury" or "property damage" resulting from the handling, use or condition of any item the "insured" makes, sells or distributes if the injury or damage occurs after the "insured" has given up possession of the item.

Wrong Delivery of Liquid Products

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" resulting from the delivery of any liquid into the wrong receptacle or to the wrong address, or from the delivery of one liquid for another, if the "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurs after the delivery has been completed.

Delivery is considered completed even if further service or maintenance work, or correction, repair or replacement is required because of wrong delivery.

Professional Services

"Bodily injury":

However, the insurance afforded to such additional insured described above:

- a. Only applies to the extent permitted by law; and
- **b.** Will not be broader than that which you are required by the contract or agreement to provide for such additional insured.

A person's or organization's status as an additional insured for ongoing operations ends when your operations for the person or organization described in Paragraph 1. above are completed.

With respect to insurance afforded to these additional insureds for ongoing operations, this insurance does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurring after:

- a. All work, including material, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work, on the project (other than service, maintenance or repairs) to be performed by or on behalf of the additional insured(s) at the location of the covered operations has been completed: or
- b. that operation of "your work" out of which the injury or damage arises has been put to its intended use by any person or organization other than another contractor or subcontractor engaged in performing operations for a principal as a part of the same project.
