A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AND EXECUTE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ("FDEP") GRANT AGREEMENT NUMBER NS111 RELATED TO THE RECONSTRUCTION OF THE A-14 WATER CONTROL STRUCTURE IN THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of environmental Protection ("FDEP") is willing to enter into a grant agreement to provide financial assistance to the City to complete reconstruction of the A-14 Water Control Structure in the City of Port St. Lucie, identified as "Project", that states the terms and conditions upon which FDEP funds will be provided and sets forth the manner in which the project will be undertaken and completed; and

**WHEREAS,** the project scope for Grant Agreement NS111, attached hereto as Exhibit "A," consists of completing the reconstruction of the A-14 Water Control Structure in the City of Port St. Lucie; and

**WHEREAS,** the FDEP and the City desire to enter into the Grant Agreement in substantially the form attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "A," pursuant to Section 215.971, Florida Statutes; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council hereby determines that the parties may enter into this Grant Agreement as it serves a public purpose,

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Ratification of Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are hereby ratified and confirmed as true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Resolution.

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Conflict.</u> If any resolutions, or parts of resolutions, are in conflict herewith, this Resolution shall control to the extent of the conflicting provisions.

<u>Section 3</u>. <u>Severability</u>. The provisions of this Resolution are intended to be severable. If any part of this Resolution is determined to be void or is declared illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Resolution shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
