

RESOLUTION 26-R

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE, FLORIDA APPROVING THE APPOINTMENT OF ONE (1) SPECIAL MAGISTRATE UPON RECOMMENDATION AND ADVICE OF THE CITY ATTORNEY; APPROVAL OF THE AGREEMENT GOVERNING SAID APPOINTMENT; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida (the “City”) pursuant to Chapter 162, Florida Statutes, adopted a code enforcement system that utilizes special magistrates who shall have all the powers and authority of a code enforcement board, per City Code of Ordinances, Chapter 37, Article I, Section 37.01; and

WHEREAS, under the City Code of Ordinances, Chapter 37, Article II, Section 37.04(a), the City Council shall appoint, by resolution, at least three (3) special magistrates per year; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to City Code of Ordinances, Chapter 37, Article II, Section 37.04(a), the City Attorney has recommended to the City Manager the appointment of Jamy Barreau, Esq., to serve as Special Magistrate for the City; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Barreau has executed an agreement memorializing the terms of the Special Magistrate’s appointment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Recitals. The City Council of the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida hereby adopts and ratifies those matters set forth in the foregoing recitals.

Section 2. Appointment of Special Magistrate. The City Council hereby appoints Mr. Barreau as Special Magistrate and approves the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit “A” for his appointment pursuant to City Code of Ordinances, Chapter 37, Article II, Section 37.04.

Section 3. Execution of Documents. The City Manager or his designee is hereby authorized to execute all documents related to the appointment of the Special Magistrate, per City Code of Ordinances, Chapter 37, Article II, Section 37.04, and to take all actions necessary and proper to accomplish the aims of this Resolution.

Section 4. Conflict. If any Resolution, or parts of any resolution, are in conflict herewith, this Resolution shall control to the extent of the conflicting provisions.

Section 5. Severability. The provisions of this Resolution are intended to be severable. If any part of this Resolution is determined to be void or is held to be illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, then the remainder of this Resolution shall remain in full force and effect and this Resolution shall nevertheless stand and be construed as if the illegal or invalid part or portion had not been included herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
