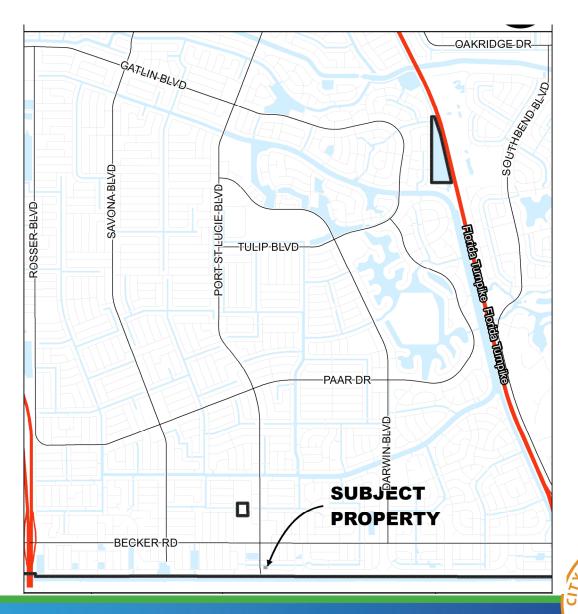
- Rezone 0.46-acres of land from Professional (P) to Single-Family Residential (RS-2); and
- Purpose of request: To allow for the property (2 lots) to be developed with 2 single-family residences.
- This proposal is concurrent to P20-209 Small-Scale Future Land Use Map Amendment.

Background:

- Two lots make up the 0.46-acres of land proposed for rezoning. The properties' addresses are 771 SW Abode Avenue and 785 Abode Avenue.
- Under P03-343, the lots were rezoned from Single-Family Residential (RS-2) to the current designation of Professional (P).
- On October 26, 2020, the City Council directed staff to initiate a rezoning of the two lots from Professional (P) back to Single-Family Residential (RS-2).
