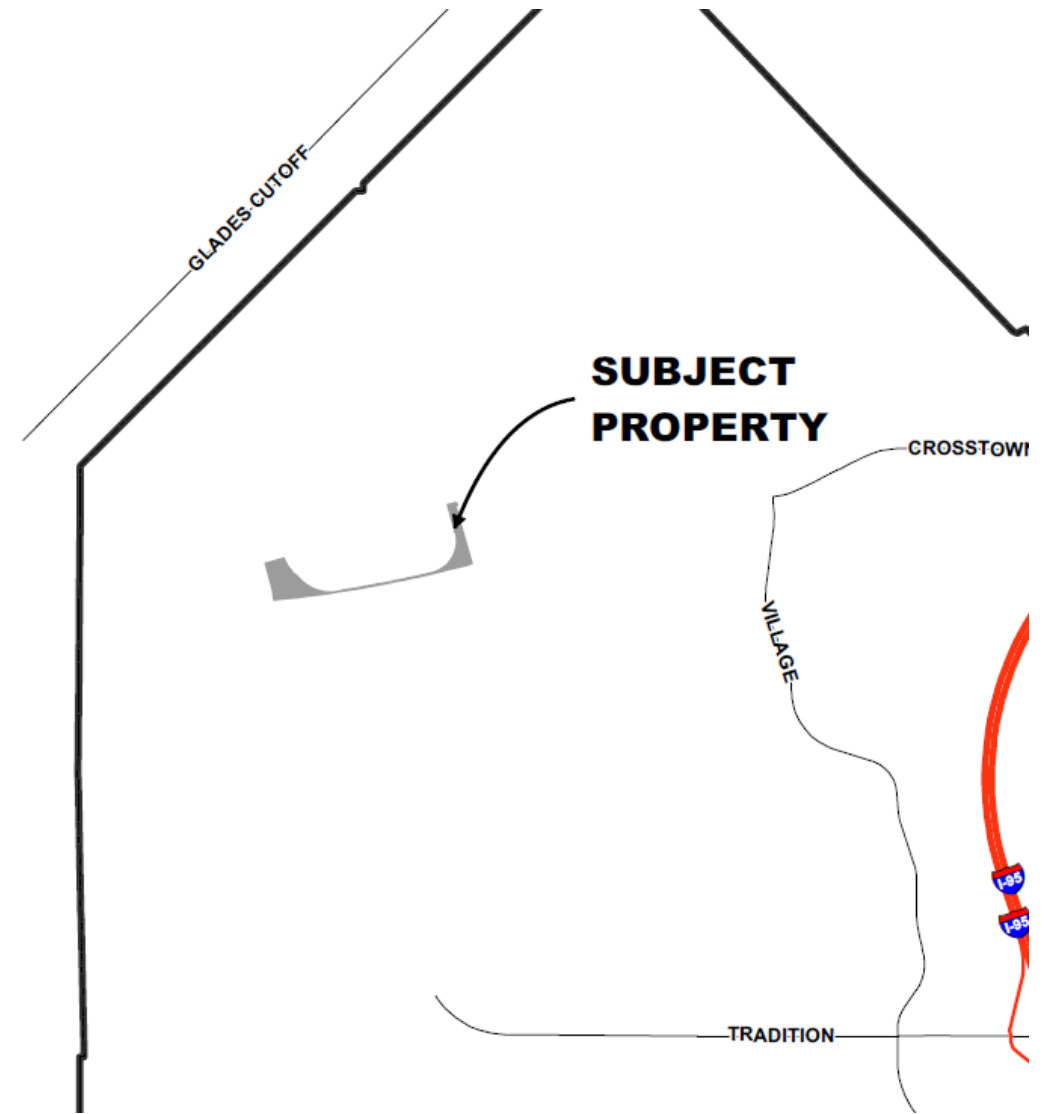

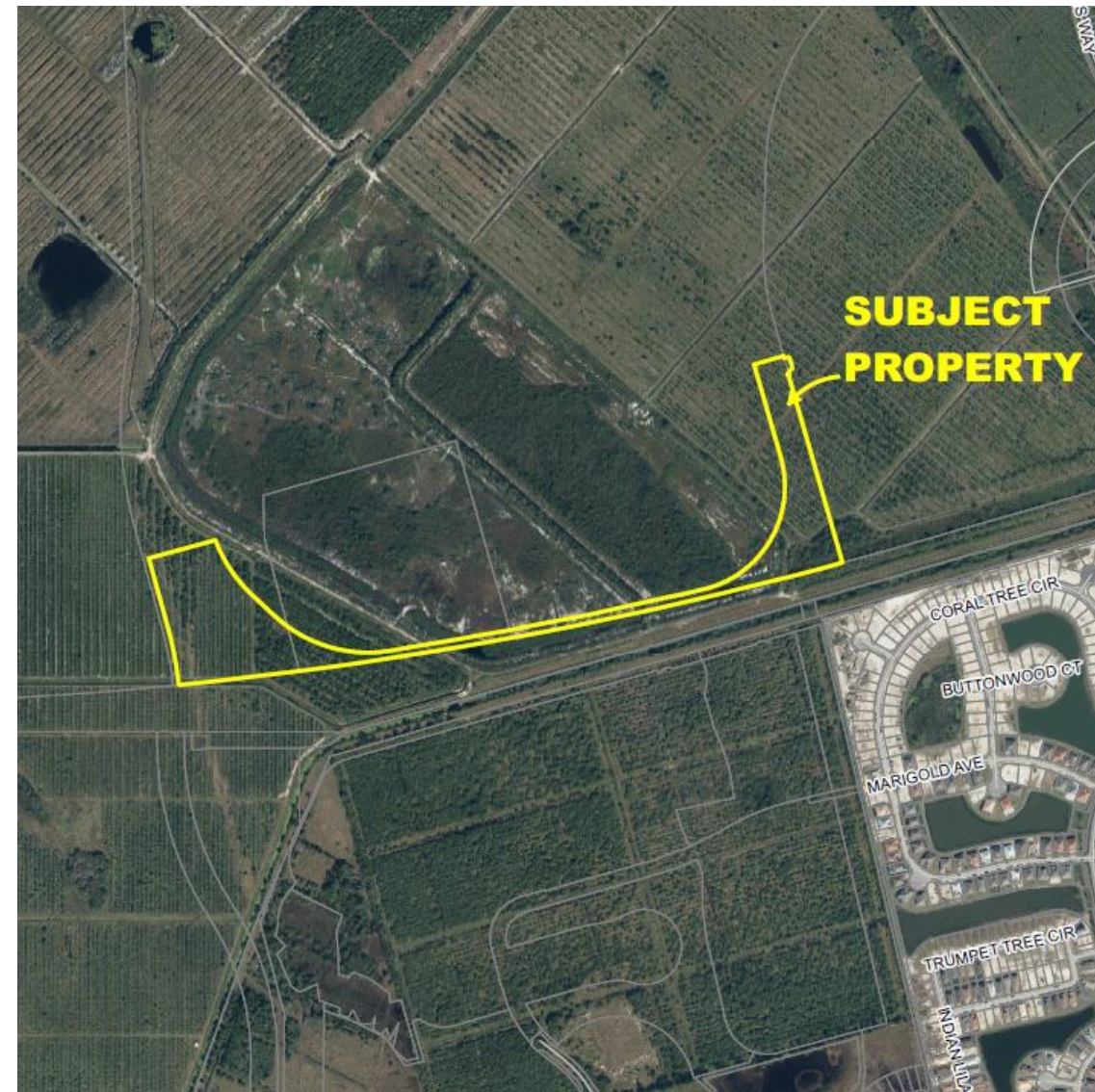
This 20.9-acre preliminary and final subdivision plat is proposed to create:

- Private road right-of-way dedicated to the VERANO PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC.

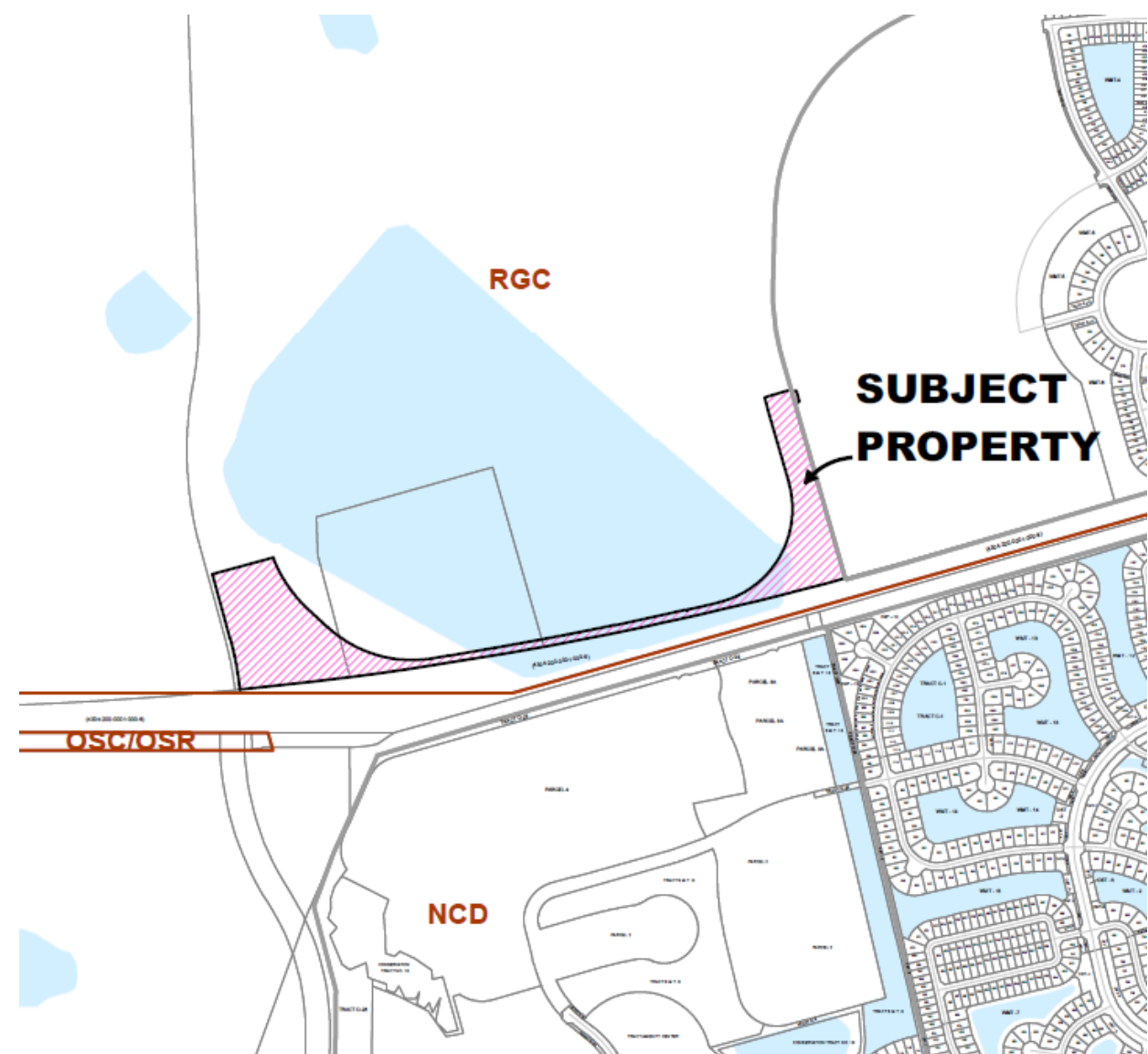
Subject property



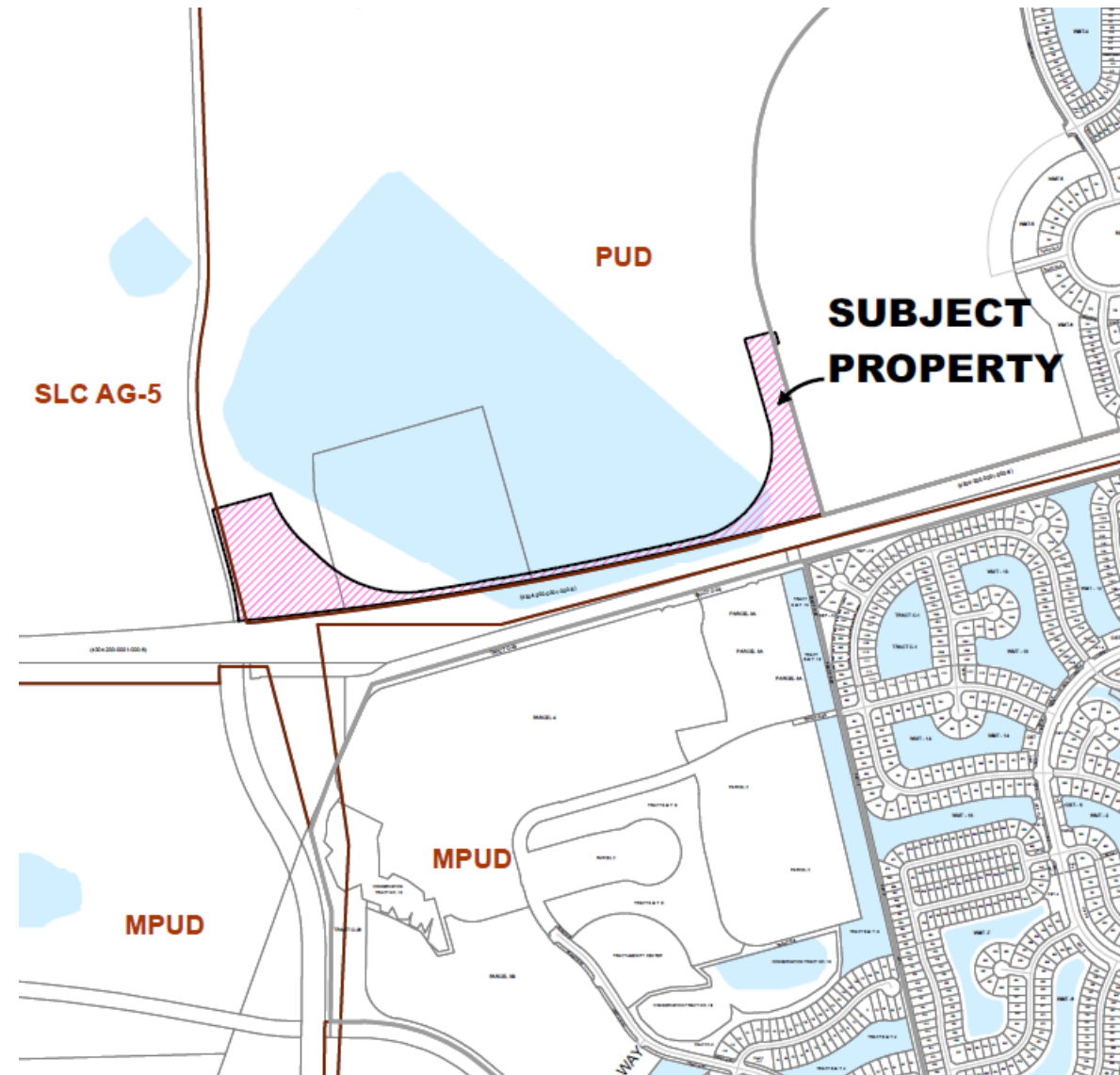
Aerial

Concurrency Review

The project has been reviewed for compliance with PGA Village (Verano) Development of Regional Impact Development Order regarding provision of adequate public facilities.

The Public Works Department found the transportation elements of the project to be in compliance with the adopted level of service and requirements of Chapter 156 of City Code, Public Works Policy 19-01pwd and the latest Development Order for the referenced project.

Latest Trip Counts

Shopping Center

PM Peak = 403 Trips

Single-Family Residential

PM Peak = 1,429 Trips

Residential Townhouse

PM Peak = 187 Trips

Total Trips = 2,019

(based on estimated building permits,
November 2021)

- No additional roadway requirements are triggered at this time.
- Improvements required within the current DRI have already been completed beyond what is required per the current trip counts.
- 5,023 total PM peak hour trips triggers 2 lane extension of Crosstown to North-South A which is currently under design.
