# MURAL AT MINSKY GYM PUBLIC ART PROJECT

### **BACKGROUND**


- National Endowment for the Arts (NEA):
  - Independent Federal Agency that offers funding and support for projects exhibiting artistic excellence.
- NEA Challenge America Grant:
  - Offers support primarily for projects that extend the reach of the arts to underserved populations – those whose opportunities to experience the arts are limited by geography, ethnicity, economics, or disability.
- The City of Port St. Lucie has been approved for a \$10,000 Challenge America grant.
  - Grant amount requested: \$10,000
  - Local Match: \$10,000
  - Total Project Cost: \$20,000

### PROJECT PURPOSE

- Create a "City for All People" themed mural on the wall of the 8,000-square foot Robert E. Minsky Gym to provide an opportunity for the community to experience art and celebrate the City's diversity. At this time, there is no public art in the surrounding area.
- The mural will be placed on the exterior wall that faces Southwest Darwin Boulevard.
- The project site itself is centrally located in the community, adjacent to Windmill Park Elementary School, Whispering Pines Park and Treasure Coast High School.

### **INPUT EARLY**

- On November 18, 2020, staff attended and presented at the City's Diversity Team meeting. Input received included for the mural to incorporate different sport activities and recreational elements such as a park backdrop.
- As part of 2021 Citizen Summit held on March 6, 2021, residents were informed of the future mural to be placed on the Minsky Gymnasium wall. Residents were posed the question "What Makes Port St. Lucie Diverse?" Responses were included in the Call to Artist.

### CALL TO ARTIST

- On April 1, 2021, a Call to Artist was made public requesting interested artists submit an application and submission packet for a "City for All People" themed mural.
- In their proposal, artists were required to incorporate a diverse group of persons such as different races, colors, ethnicities, age groups, all abilities within their mural concept.
- Artists also were encouraged to incorporate Parks and Recreation activities or elements, children-based participating in various recreational sports or activities, or a portrait-style concept with diverse group of persons.
- The Call to Artist was closed on May 2, 2021 and a total of 18 artists answered the call.



#### SUBMISSIONS REVIEW & RANKING

- Project Review Team assembled to consider the following for each:
  - Ability to meet the identified theme, submitted mural concept and how well it incorporates a diverse group of persons, that all required submittal materials are provided, and ability to meet the specified completion deadline.
- A scoring criteria was established to evaluate each Call to Artist submission packet, as seen below:

Project Management (10)
Future Maintenance (5)
Local Artist (5)
