Deputy Director Kean indicated that the Staff and the Applicant could not agree on the Annexation Agreement and recommended denial.

Steve Garrett, Lucido and Associates, represented the Applicant and provided an overview of their position for the project.

Mayor Martin stated there was a stalemate because after the first transmittal was heard, the agreement was that the first two lanes would be built all the way out to the edge of the property, but over time, that changed. She explained that after the first transmittal hearing, there was disagreement, and a struggle arose over the build-out of the road all the way as committed to verbally. Mayor Martin indicated other struggles followed soon after. She advised that she cannot support the Amendment and explained that she had a problem with unkept promises and verbal commitments.

Councilman Bonna advised that he cannot support adding any new entitlements.

Vice Mayor Caraballo indicated this area should be industrial and hopes that the owner of the site will be willing to work with the City and create a successful plan.

Councilman Pickett stated he would not be supportive of this item.

Councilwoman Morgan spoke on the condition of Glades Cut Off Road and advised that she cannot be supportive of the item.

There being no further discussion, Councilman Bonna moved to deny Resolution 25-R58. Councilman Pickett seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

It was the consensus of the City Council to move forward and hear what is next, and to schedule one-on-one meetings with outside counsel.

She announced the City's PSL in Progress webpage, an interactive website that highlights projects across the City, such as traffic improvement projects, parks, and drainage system updates.

Councilman Pickett advised that he attended the ribbon-cutting of Florida Coast Medical Center, the 9/11 Remembrance Ceremony, a ribbon-cutting for Homes for Heroes, a St. Lucie County Roundtable Meeting, a POW/MIA Removers Ceremony, and a Guest Speaker for the Gold Star Mothers' Ceremony. He reminded the community to attend the City's Oktoberfest on Saturday, October 4th, at the MidFlorida Event Center.

Vice Mayor Caraballo stated that she attended the IRSC Promise Leadership Meeting, the 9/11 Remembrance Ceremony, the All-America City Celebration, the Florida League of Cities Board of Directors' Meeting, and the Gold Star Mothers' Ceremony.

Vice Mayor Caraballo noted that while at the 9/11 Remembrance Ceremony, she noticed the condition of the City Fountain and Beam display. She added that since the 25th anniversary is next year, it may be a good time to clean and refurbish and asked for an item to come back to the City Council with a cost estimate.
