Strategic Initiative: Neighborhood Improvement & Engagement



FY 21/22 Progress

- Education Partnerships: Boys & Girls Club of St. Lucie County Mobile Club operating at City Parks, Civic Scholars Internship Program launched, Government Week expanded.
- Expanded Community Engagement: New Community Engagement Manager hired to support expansive efforts. Planning for Citizen Summit 2.0 underway.
- Smart & Sustainable City: Interdepartmental team launched. Planned projects include implementing Smart City and Resilient PSL -- developing stormwater models, supplemental vulnerability assessment, resiliency plan, adaptation plan and community outreach. USDOT Smart Grant submitted November 2022.
- Improve Performance Through Innovation: Following launch of one of the first virtual innovation academies in the U.S., staff is planning an in-person academy and seeking What Works Cities certification. Recent innovation projects focused on procurement and grants.

- Develop Master Plan for City Center: City Center Master Plan underway, public outreach planned for December 2022 and update to Council at Winter Workshop.
- Southern Grove: ±120 acres anticipated to close by end of 2022. 321.87 net acres sold to date for development. Tom Mackie Phase 3 under construction and Phase 4 under design.
- Fully leverage partnership with Cleveland Clinic & FIU Center for Translational Science: FIU ribbon cutting for its Center for Translational Science. Cleveland Clinic Purchase agreement for 44.2 acres to expand its medical research campus.
- Work Local Initiative: City Job Fair well attended with over 40 vendors.
- Support Business Development: \$60,000 in Small Business Grants distributed

FY 21/22 Progress

- Accelerate Construction of Port St. Lucie
 Boulevard South: PSL Segment 2.1 construction ongoing and to be completed December 2023
- Expedite the Implementation of Adaptive Traffic Signal Control (ATSC) on PSL Boulevard from Gatlin to US 1: Fully operational in October 2022. Project complete.
- Citywide Fiber Network & Wi Fi: IT Project
 Manager has been hired and fiber project
 launched.
- Design and Construct Public Works
 Administrative Complex: Selection process to be completed by February 2023
- Public Transit Enhancement Plan: Design for Intermodal Facility to be completed December 2022

- Implement Multimodal Plan: Implementation of Five-Year Plan underway.
- Design the Village Green Drive Corridor Revitalization Project: Seeking grant funds for corridor design. Design of Hogpen Trail Boardwalk and Shared Use Paths planned for FY 22/23
- St. Lucie River/C-23 Water Quality Project:
 Area 4 to be completed December 2022
- Implement Septic to Sewer Master Plan Annual Projects and Education Program: Since 1994, 9,641 Residential properties have been voluntarily converted septic to City sewer service.
- Stormwater Management Program: Swale liner discussion has been scheduled for the November Special City Council Meeting.







 boardwalk under PSL Blvd to begin.
 Negotiations for waterfront restaurant
 development are underway.
- Improve O.L. Peacock, Sr. Preserve: O.L. Peacock Sr. Preserve Concept Plan complete, FRDAP grant submitted
- Parkland Acquisition and Environmental Lands/Green Space Preservation Program: Staff is now working on city owned property as HPPS sites along with HPPS Conservation Lands Branding.
- Implement Bikeways & Trails Priority
 Corridors: Wilderness Trail design complete,
 with construction scheduled to begin Spring
 2023
- Winterlakes Park Phase 2: Winterlakes Park Phase 2 construction to begin

- Tradition Regional Park: Tradition Phase 1
 Construction to begin Spring 2023 following
 agreement resolution.
- Torino Regional Park: Torino Phase 1 Construction to begin Summer 2023
- McCarty Ranch Camping Enhancements:
 Funding for the development of a camping and recreation "Master Plan" at McCarty Ranch has been included as part of the FY 2022-2023 CIP Budget, planning to begin in FY23.
- Implement the Public Art Master Plan:
 Public Art Master Plan continues to be implemented, Call for Artists for FY 22/23 includes roundabouts and the City Hall Mural
- Expand Cultural Offerings/Special Events: Expansion of Cultural Offerings / Special Events continues. New events include International Festival planned for September 2023.





Goal 6: Culture, Nature & Fun Activities

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- Reduce the Millage: City reduced millage for the seventh year in a row. The City's long-term debt has been reduced from a high of more than \$1.042 billion in debt in FY 09/10 to a projected \$665.4 million for FY 22/23 based upon the budgeted principal payments. This will represent a 36% reduction in debt over the past 13 years.
- Organizational Development: Launched revamped orientation "Keys to the City"
- Implemented a "New Hire" page on Water Cooler.
- NES survey conducted third year in a row. Life Scan expanded for all employees
- Advance Intergovernmental Priorities: Staff continues to work to advance intergovernmental priorities at state and federal level.
- Citywide Vision and Identity Citywide Vision and Identity scheduled for Winter 2023. City Hall Lobby redesign underway
- 1PSL: 1PSL has gained popularity with an increase of 131% in call volume which can be attributed to solid waste.






