

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING THE RE-IMPOSITION AND COLLECTION OF STORMWATER ASSESSMENTS

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING TO RE-IMPOSE AND PROVIDE FOR COLLECTION OF STORMWATER ASSESSMENTS.

Notice is hereby given that the City Council of the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida ("City"), will conduct a public hearing to re-impose Stormwater Assessments (the "Assessments") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2021, within the incorporated area of the City. The purpose of the stormwater assessment is to provide funding for a stormwater management system to maintain and improve drainage in the City.

The City hereby provides notice, pursuant to Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes, of its intent to levy special assessments within the incorporated area of the City to provide stormwater management in the City. The Assessment will be collected by the St. Lucie County Tax Collector on the non-ad valorem portion of the tax bill to be mailed in November 2021, as authorized by Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes. The City proposes the rate of \$168 per year for one equivalent residential unit (ERU) for fiscal year 2021/2022 and subsequent years unless changed by the City Council. The base unit of measurement (ERU) is the average impervious area for a single-family residence and is equal to 2,280 square feet as it represents the largest uniform class of developed property.

A public hearing (the "Hearing") will be held at 6:30 p.m. on Monday, August 23rd, 2021, in Council Chambers at City Hall, Building A, 121 S.W. Port St. Lucie Blvd., Port St. Lucie, Florida 34984 for the purpose of (a) receiving and considering comments on the Assessments from affected property owners and the public; (b) considering the adoption of the annual rate resolution for the upcoming fiscal year, and (c) authorizing the re-imposition of the Assessments for stormwater for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2021, and collecting such assessments on the same bill as ad valorem taxes. All affected property owners have the right to appear at the Hearing and to file written objections with the City Clerk within 20 days of the publication of this notice. Attendance at this Hearing is NOT mandatory. Please visit http://www.cityofpsl.com/ty for new public comment options. At the Hearing, the Council shall receive the written objections and shall hear testimony from all interested persons.

All objections to the annual rate resolution by the Council shall be made in writing and filed with the City Clerk at or before the time or adjourned time of the Hearing. If a person decides to appeal any decision made by the City Council with respect to any matter considered at the Hearing, such person will be responsible for making a verbatim record of the testimony, evidence, and any other matters presented. No stenographic record by a certified court reporter will be provided at the Hearing. Each such person is required to provide his or her own. In accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, persons needing special accommodations should contact the City Clerk's office at (772) 871-5157 at least seven (7) days prior to the Hearing.

Unless proper steps are initiated with a court of competent jurisdiction to secure relief within thirty (30) days from the date of City Council action at the Hearing, such action shall be the final adjudication of the issues presented. Copies of the legal documentation for the assessment collection are available in the City Clerk's office, located at 121 S.W. Port St. Lucie Blvd., Port St. Lucie, Florida 34984. Failure to pay the Assessment shall cause a tax certificate to be issued against the property, which may result in a loss of title to the property.

The property subject to the assessment is depicted below:



Please note that this is not a new charge and it may have appeared on the tax bill of affected property owners in prior years. The charge on such tax bills last year was based on a rate of \$163.00 per ERU. Pursuant to Atlantic Gulf Communities v. City of Port St. Lucie, 764 So. 2d 14 (Fla. 4th DCA, 1999), every time the fee is levied for the first time or the rate of the fee is changed, the City is required by law to provide notice.
