Tab V Experience, Ability and References

- **A. AOS Experience -** All On Stage has been providing professional Sound, Stage and Lighting services since 2006. As discussed in our introduction, we are the contracted vendor for numerous South Florida municipalities including Boca Raton, Boynton Beach, Coral Springs, Dania Beach, Deerfield Beach, Fort Lauderdale, and Lauderdale-by-the-Sea and we are the preferred vendor for the Delray Beach Downtown Development Authority (DDA), providing full production for the majority of their shows at Old School Square Amphitheater. We provide production services for ~250 shows each year across all of our clients. These productions range from all sizes and types of events from the DBO Tennis Tournament AV; to theatrical performances at the Wold Theater of Lynn University; to Conferences/Symposiums in various hotels throughout south FL; to large July 4th festivals and major concerts. The dollar values of these individual events are wide-ranging, from \$1000 to \$200k+.
- B. AOS Team / Org / Philosophy All On Stage is a fully insured (GL, WC, Auto) full service event production company that provides everything from Sound, Lighting, Video, Staging, and Backline Equipment along with the technical expertise required to operate the gear. AOS is run by Dan Fryburg and Domenic Garafola who work directly with AOS' clients and City contacts in advance of planned events to ensure all aspects of each event are covered and prepared for. Dan and Dom are heavily involved in the physical prep and set up for each event as well, assisting their team of extremely qualified technicians and stage hands to make sure all of the correct gear is loaded onto the truck (see Exhibit 4 on Pg 16), safely brought to the event and set up safely, correctly and efficiently. At All On Stage, we know how much work the City personnel put into planning each event, so we take our role very seriously. We emphasize a few key aspects to ensure successful outcomes:
 - a. Exceptional Technicians / Staff (see section D)
 - b. High Quality & Well Maintained Equipment: Our secure, 8,000 square foot warehouse houses large quantities of high-quality equipment (see Exhibit "VI" pg 11) that we are constantly updating. Our assets include: Dozens of line-array speaker cabinets and subwoofers for large concerts; Big shelves full of powered speakers for monitor rigs or smaller events (like the sound systems for the Mayor to speak at); Dozens of top-of-the-line wireless and wired microphones; Multiple types of staging for all staging needs in this RFP; Hundreds of LED video wall panels to build screens of all sizes; dozens of LED light fixtures and haze/fog/snow machines for everything from simple stage washes to exciting lighting shows; hundreds of feet of aluminum trussing to build structures like a normal video wall support system or large trussing "boxes" as is required for St. Patrick's day; and more. We very, very rarely experience equipment failure (as all of our clients can attest to), as we regularly service all equipment (weekly or even daily depending on the rate of usage) in addition to purchasing new equipment every 3-5 years to ensure that our gear has plenty of useful life left.
 - c. Prioritizing Safety: As our clients can speak to, we are always on time for our set-ups and leave ample time to make sure everything is set up properly and in a way most conducive to the safety of the City employees, artists and attendees at the event. We are fully insured and consult with an engineer to ensure all structures (particularly trussing build-outs for our video walls) are built safely and securely. The equipment is first inspected at the warehouse before being loaded onto the truck, and we conduct a walk-through / make a plan for any new venue we are working at. We always make sure the foundations for all structures are level and carefully attach heavy duty straps and steel to secure them. At no extra charge, we habitually bring items like rubber cable-mats and gaff tape to the events where there may be long cable runs in an effort to ensure nobody trips on a cable and hurts themselves. We also bring sandbags to be placed everywhere necessary to avoid any issue from strong winds, as well as make sure all of our power distribution equipment is safely covered and protected from the elements (as well as distanced from patrons) to avoid any electrical mishaps with a performer or stage-side attendee.

- C. AOS Familiarity w/ Scope of Work AOS has been servicing municipalities and, more specifically, the City of Delray for many years. All the events listed in this RFP are events that we have produced many times and are extremely familiar with. This experience is extremely valuable because it ensures events are executed efficiently and effectively with less time & energy spent from the City to ensure the AV portion of the event is being done well. For example, with events like the Delray Tree Lighting or Fourth of July, there are many moving pieces. Given street closures, crowd control/security, entertainment requirements and time constraints, there is very little margin for error. Our knowledge of the City's events and having successfully produced them many times should give the City's selection committee peace of mind that they will be in great hands with our team. Working with many municipalities has prepared us well for events of all types and sizes. We are comfortable setting up any event from 50 attendees to 10,000+ with national act riders, and are extremely prepared for difficult load-in's / having to battle the outdoor elements (rain, wind, etc.). As members of the City's event team know – we thrive in these situations and we are familiar with running events in bad weather where our equipment can sometimes get damaged. We always take this adversity in stride, and always arrive with extra equipment to replace the broken gear when these situations arise.
- D. AOS Staff The professionalism and technical expertise of our technicians been essential in making all of the City of Delray Beach's (and our other Cities') events successful. Our Techs not only all have a minimum of 10 years' experience in the industry, but many of them have been on tour with major recording artists (from artists like Little Anthony up to Pink Floyd) and we can safely say that they are all masters of their respective crafts. Our Audio Engineers are comfortable on all consoles (Midas, Behringer, Avid, Digico, Yahama & more) and our lighting technicians are familiar with all major lighting consoles (GrandMA, Avolite, Chamsys, etc.) which is essential to supporting both the local artists and national acts – and all of our technicians know exactly what is required at each of the City's venues. Just as important as the knowledge and technical abilities of our techs is how friendly, helpful and prompt they are. Our team is always on time, and whether interacting with the client, the artists, or an attendee at the event, our technicians are very well-spoken and kind. They all operate with the goal of doing the best job possible for everyone involved in the show. Additionally, we have plenty of reliable stage hands that are always friendly and extremely proficient in safely driving, loading and unloading our trucks. We have the personnel to match our substantial amount of equipment and we can handle 4+ large events on the same day as evidenced most recently July 4th, NYE and other major holidays. Below you'll find basic info on some of our main engineers:

Seth Goldman has been a concert FOH and MON engineer and designer since the 1970's, touring with platinum artists like Pink Floyd, Prince, Cindy Lauper, David Bowie, James Taylor, Mariah Carey, Lionel Ritchie and more. Seth is an authority in the audio world, and his proficiencies span all types of digital audio consoles. Seth is a top-tier resource for all-things systems tech, sound system design and concert sound engineering.

Anthony "Tony" Bello has been audio engineering since the early 2000's, where he was the A1 Engineer at a prominent country living facility in Broward County before doing various circuits with Marshall Tucker, Jefferson Starship, Little Anthony, The Rascals, and more. Anthony also has expertise in electronic repair, DMX patching and programming, as well as speaker cabinet construction / repair – all of which are useful at the City's shows.

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Arthur "Art" Weems, the son of two opera singers (Calvin and Dorris Weems), began working as a sound engineer at the early age of 14 in Detroit, Michigan. Art's lifetime of experience has allowed him to master a diverse skillset across mixing, DJing and as a Drum Technician. Art has an incredible resume, having worked with the Charlie Daniels, DMX, the Bee Gees, Keith Sweat, Travis Tritt, Freddie Jackson, Salt & Pepper, Color Me Bad, Naji, Johnnie Lang, Brothers Johnson, and the list goes on.

Helder Balisa has been a Video and Lighting engineer for over 15 years. He is an expert video mapper with programs like NOVA LCT, Resolume and Playback Pro and he has been the crew lead setting up LED Video Walls of all sizes for the last 10 years. In addition to his LED Video Wall prowess, Helder is an elite lighting designer & operator – running lighting consoles of all types and fixtures of all brands to bring together amazing light shows that leave many of our national acts inquiring about hiring him to go on tour with them.

Andre Angelo De Jesus received his degree in control engineering and automation (mechatronics) from the University of Brazil, and followed that up with two Masters degrees in electronical engineering and in safety engineering. In addition to creating executive and technical designs for mounting events, theaters, concerts, trade shows and conferences, he is a designer, consultant and specialist in the installation of audio, lighting, special effects, LED panels, and engineering solutions for events in the areas of computation engine, electricity, electronics, automation and control mechanisms. He has produced events for many different performers that include: Shakira, Julio Iglesias, Bruno E Marrone, Titas and Edson Cordeiro.

Wellington T. De Faria (Will) spent ten plus years as an LED supplier and lighting designer specializing in intelligent lighting, DMX patching, programming, live console operation and screens for concerts and special events through his company, Excell Productions. Additional Services:

As you will hear from our references, All On Stage Productions does a wonderful job producing every event we are a part of, largely the result of the excellent equipment and best-in-class technicians we provide to every show. In addition to the physical production of the event, there are plenty of other services we provide for our clients, (many of which don't actually show up on the invoice!) but we pride ourselves on putting in the effort to make life as easy as possible for our clients and produce the best event possible. These services include:

Advancing Full Production with City & Artists – Leading up to every show, Dan or another staff member proactively connects with the City to be sure everyone is on the same page about all event details (which often evolve) to ensure the event will be successfully produced. Dan also always takes the initiative to reach out to every artist before each show, which can be fairly time intensive especially with festival-style line-ups. We ask all artists what their needs are and confirm what we are bringing to support them - everything from the front-of-house PA system, the type of monitors and microphones on stage, the lights that will be on site, as well as who our technician(s) will be. We also offer them the opportunity to connect with our technicians in advance if they'd like to. From there, we coordinate the loadin schedule and sound-check times to be sure everyone is prepared and on the same page. Additional Labor Services – AOS also has the capability to handle other aspects of events that are not specified within our production contracts. These services include very important (but often overlooked) specialties like FOH Services (ushers / ticket checkers / greeters), Stage Management (a dedicated staff member to making sure band changeovers happen on time and smoothly), as well as Videographers / Photographers.

Providing Specialty Equipment – AOS has various additional "FX" items that can be used to enhance an event. These include Confetti Machines, Fog Machines, CO2 Tanks, and others. For major holidays or other large events, the Cities we service have special off-contract requests that we always do our best to accommodate. If there is any gear that we do not have, we have wholesale relationships with other specialty-equipment companies and can usually source the equipment at an excellent price.

As expressed elsewhere in this proposal, All On Stage takes tremendous pride in creating successful events for the City of Delray Beach. If selected, we will continue to positively execute all of the City's events as well as continue to take care of all of the behind-the-scenes work (as we always have) that is required to make these events seamless. These other efforts include (but are not limited to): 1) emphasizing communication and advancing/planning every show with both the City and the Performers; 2) testing equipment + building an inventory list (see Exhibit 4, Page 18) before each event; and 3) carefully staffing each event to ensure the best personnel for the particular show are assigned, respectively, and giving them all of the pertinent information so that they are able to perform at their best.





Special rules for partnerships. Further, in certain cases where a Form W-9 has not been received, the rules under section 1446 require a partnership to presume that a partner is a foreign person, and pay the section 1446 withholding tax. Therefore, if you are a U.S. person that is a partner in a partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States, provide Form W-9 to the partnership to establish your U.S. status and avoid section 1446 withholding on your share of partnership income.

In the cases below, the following person must give Form W-9 to the partnership for purposes of establishing its U.S. status and avoiding withholding on its allocable share of net income from the partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States:

- In the case of a disregarded entity with a U.S. owner, the U.S. owner of the disregarded entity and not the entity;

Foreign person. If you are a foreign person or the U.S. branch of a foreign bank that has elected to be treated as a U.S. person, do not use Form W-9. Instead, use the appropriate Form W-8 or Form 8233 (see Publication 515, Withholding of Tax on Nonresident Aliens and Foreign Entities).

Nonresident alien who becomes a resident alien. Generally, only a nonresident alien individual may use the terms of a tax treaty to reduce or eliminate U.S. tax on certain types of income. However, most tax treaties contain a provision known as a "saving clause." Exceptions specified in the saving clause may permit an exemption from tax to continue for certain types of income even after the payee has otherwise become a U.S. resident alien for tax purposes.

If you are a U.S. resident alien who is relying on an exception contained in the saving clause of a tax treaty to claim an exemption from U.S. tax on certain types of income, you must attach a statement to Form W-9 that specifies the following five items:

- 2. The treaty article addressing the income.
- 3. The article number (or location) in the tax treaty that contains the saving clause and its exceptions.
 - 4. The type and amount of income that qualifies for the exemption from tax.
- 5. Sufficient facts to justify the exemption from tax under the terms of the treaty article.

Example. Article 20 of the U.S.-China income tax treaty allows an exemption from tax for scholarship income received by a Chinese student temporarily present in the United States. Under U.S. law, this student will become a resident alien for tax purposes if his or her stay in the United States exceeds 5 calendar years. However, paragraph 2 of the first Protocol to the U.S.-China treaty (dated April 30, 1984) allows the provisions of Article 20 to continue to apply even after the Chinese student becomes a resident alien of the United States. A Chinese student who qualifies for this exception (under paragraph 2 of the first protocol) and is relying on this exception to claim an exemption from tax on his or her scholarship or fellowship income would attach to Form W-9 a statement that includes the information described above to support that exemption.

If you are a nonresident alien or a foreign entity, give the requester the appropriate completed Form W-8 or Form 8233.

Backup Withholding

What is backup withholding? Persons making certain payments to you must under certain conditions withhold and pay to the IRS 28% of such payments. This is called "backup withholding." Payments that may be subject to backup withholding include interest, tax-exempt interest, dividends, broker and barter exchange transactions, rents, royalties, nonemployee pay, payments made in settlement of payment card and third party network transactions, and certain payments from fishing boat operators. Real estate transactions are not subject to backup withholding.

You will not be subject to backup withholding on payments you receive if you give the requester your correct TIN, make the proper certifications, and report all your taxable interest and dividends on your tax return.

Payments you receive will be subject to backup withholding if:

- 1. You do not furnish your TIN to the requester,
- 2. You do not certify your TIN when required (see the Part II instructions on page 3 for details).

- 3. The IRS tells the requester that you furnished an incorrect TIN,
- 4. The IRS tells you that you are subject to backup withholding because you did not report all your interest and dividends on your tax return (for reportable interest and dividends only), or

What is FATCA reporting?

The Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act (FATCA) requires a participating foreign financial institution to report all United States account holders that are specified United States persons. Certain payees are exempt from FATCA reporting. See Exemption from FATCA reporting code on page 3 and the Instructions for the Requester of Form W-9 for more information.

Updating Your Information

You must provide updated information to any person to whom you claimed to be an exempt payee if you are no longer an exempt payee and anticipate receiving reportable payments in the future from this person. For example, you may need to provide updated information if you are a C corporation that elects to be an S corporation, or if you no longer are tax exempt. In addition, you must furnish a new Form W-9 if the name or TIN changes for the account; for example, if the grantor of a grantor trust dies.

Penalties

Failure to furnish TIN. If you fail to furnish your correct TIN to a requester, you are subject to a penalty of \$50 for each such failure unless your failure is due to reasonable cause and not to willful neglect.

- INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE: (a) Seller shall defend, indemnify and hold Buyer, its employees, its customers and users of the purchased Articles, harmless from any property damage, personal injuries, or death arising out of Seller's (or its subcontractor's) work or performance hereunder and shall procure and maintain liability insurance, including contractual liability coverage, with minimum limits of \$300,000 combined single limits to be effective during period of warranty with such higher limits as Buyer shall reasonably request of Seller. Seller shall on or before delivery of the Articles purchased hereunder, furnish to Buyer a Certificate of Insurance evidencing the foregoing coverage and limits. (b) Seller shall defend, indemnify and hold Buyer harmless from the assessments by any third party of any liquidated damages or proven actual damages arising out of the failure of Seller to timely deliver the Articles purchased hereunder. (c) Seller shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Buyer, its officers, directors, agents and employees from and against any and all damages, charges, losses, (including the cost of any Articles lost by libel, condemnation, or voluntary recall) actions, and proceedings brought by the United States of America, or any State government or any agency or instrumentality thereof against Buyer, its officers, directors, agents and/or employees or assigns on such Articles by reason of any claim or findings by and said public authority that any such Articles are not as herein guaranteed.
- 4. **TERMINATION:** (a) Buyer may terminate this order, in whole or in part without liability to Buyer, if deliveries are not made at the time and in the quantities specified or in the event of a breach or failure of any of the other terms or conditions hereof. (b) Buyer may terminate this order in whole or in part, at any time for its convenience, by noticing to Seller in writing. On receipt by Seller of such notice, Seller shall, and to the extent specified therein, stop work hereunder and stop the placement of subcontractors, terminate work under subcontracts outstanding hereunder, and take any necessary action to protect property in Seller's possession in which Buyer has or may acquire an interest. Any termination claim must be submitted to Buyer within sixty (60) days after

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the effective date of the termination. (c) Any termination by Buyer, whether for default or otherwise, shall be without prejudice to any claims for damages or other rights of Buyer against Seller. (d) Buyer shall have the right to audit all elements of any termination claim and Seller shall make available to Buyer on request all books, records, and papers relating thereto.

- 5. **COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS:** Seller guarantees to Buyer that the Articles comply with all federal, state, and local laws, regulations, declarations, interpretations, and orders issued thereunder.
- 6. **CONTROLLING LAW:** This order and the performance of the parties hereunder shall be controlled and governed by the law of the State of Florida, and the venue shall be in Palm Beach County, Florida.
- 7. GENERAL: All warranties shall be construed as conditions as well as warranties. No waiver of a breach or any provision of this order shall constitute a waiver of any other breach or provision. No modification or change in, or departure from, or waiver of the provisions of this order shall be valid or binding unless approved by Buyer in writing. This order shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties. The Seller expressly agreed that any terms or conditions contained on any form or agreement other than this agreement, unless specifically agreed to otherwise by Seller and Buyer, which are not in full accord with the above stated agreement and its terms, shall be null and void.
- 8. **ALLOCATION OF RISK:** This risk for any damage to or destruction of the goods shall be borne by the Seller at all times until delivery to the control of the Buyer, which shall be the point at which the Buyer actually receives the goods for use and has accepted such.
- 9. COURSE OF PERFORMANCE: The fact that a party may accept or acquiesce in a course of performance under this agreement does not affect the meaning of this agreement even though the accepting/acquiescing party knows of the nature of the performance and has an opportunity to object to it. (With respect to this course of performance provision. any time an individual attempts to perform under the contract in a manner which is not in accord with the terms of the contract, the City must promptly object to the manner of performance.)
- 10. **PAST PRACTICES:** The previous customs and practices of the parties hereto shall not be deemed a waiver or modification of the terms hereof.
- 11. **REPAIRS NON ACCEPTANCE:** If any of the goods are delivered in a defective or non-working condition, efforts of the Buyer to correct such defect shall not constitute an acceptance where commercially reasonable in extent and cost, so that the Buyer may still reject the goods where the attempt to repair has proved unsuccessful.
- 12. **PLACE OF DELIVERY:** The goods shall be delivered to the City of Delray Beach, Florida, at address as stated on front.
- 13. **INSPECTION GOODS:** The Buyer shall have the right to inspect all goods before accepting delivery or making payment therefore. If rejected, the goods will be returned at Seller's risk, and all handling and transportation expenses, both ways, will be borne by and assumed by Seller. When material has been rejected by Buyer and returned for replacement it is essential that Seller receive new shipping instructions from Buyer before making the replacement. Inspection and approval for acceptance shall be made by the appropriate user department. The expense of inspection shall be borne by the Buyer except as to goods which are properly rejected as non-conforming. Inspection shall be made within fourteen (14) calendar days of the delivery of goods.
- 14. **NOTICE OF DEFECTS:** It is expressly agreed that all claims for alleged damages or defective goods, shortage, or other cause shall be deemed waived unless made in

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writing and sent by Buyer within twenty (20) calendar days after Buyer learns of the alleged defect, damage, shortage, or other cause giving rise to the claim, provided, however, that any defects incapable of discovery shall not be deemed waived by the provisions herein, and, provided further, that this provision shall not be deemed a waiver of any warranties set forth herein or in any modification to this agreement.

- 15. **FITNESS FOR PARTICULAR PURPOSE:** Buyer makes no warranties except as set forth herein, provided, however, that notwithstanding any other provisions to the contrary herein, Buyer may have sought the expertise of Seller with respect to the fitness for a particular purpose of the subject goods and in purchasing said goods, may have relied upon the representations of Seller as an expert with respect to the use of such goods. In that event, Seller hereby agrees that any document exhibiting a request by Buyer for goods for a particular purpose, a reliance by Buyer upon the expertise of Seller with respect to the use of the goods, or any other similar such request or reliance shall constitute a modification to the terms of this agreement which shall effect a warranty of fitness for a particular purpose.
- 16. CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGE: Seller acknowledges that Buyer has informed him that the goods are to be used by Buyer and that failure of Seller to fulfill the terms of this contract may result in consequential damages to Buyer because of the intended use to be made of the goods to the Buyer.
- 17. **TAX EXEMPTION:** The City of Delray Beach is exempt from Federal Excise Taxes. Where tax applies invoice must show gross, price, amount of tax, net price. Exemption certificate will be signed upon request.

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
