## ORDINANCE 21 -\_\_\_

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE, FLORIDA, ABANDONING THE TWENTY (20) FOOT WIDE UTILITY AND DRAINAGE EASEMENTS AFFECTING LOTS 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26 AND 27, BLOCK 1388, PORT ST. LUCIE SECTION FOURTEEN, RECORDED IN PLAT BOOK 13, PAGE(S) 5, 5A TO 5F, OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF ST. LUCIE COUNTY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS the applicant, G. Callas Holdings, LLC, requests approval for the abandonment of the existing twenty (20) foot wide rear utility and drainage easements affecting Lots 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26 and 27, Block 1388, Port St. Lucie Section Fourteen, according to the plat thereof, as recorded in Plat Book 13, Page(s) 5, 5A to 5F, of the Public Records of St. Lucie County, Florida, and more particularly described in the attached Exhibit "A" which is incorporated herein.

## NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF PORT ST. LUCIE HEREBY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Ratification of Recitals.</u> The foregoing recital is hereby ratified and confirmed as true and correct and is hereby made a part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. That the twenty (20) foot wide rear utility and drainage easements described in the attached Exhibit "A" are hereby abandoned and any right, title, or interest of the public in and to the twenty (20) foot wide rear utility and drainage easements on any recorded map or plat is hereby renounced and reclaimed.

Section 3. The effect of this Ordinance is to abandon the above-described twenty (20) foot wide rear utility and drainage easements and to renounce or disclaim any right, title, or interest of the public in and to said utility and drainage easements.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Recordation.</u> The City Council hereby directs that this Ordinance be recorded in the public records of St. Lucie County, Florida.

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Conflict.</u> If any ordinances, or parts of ordinances, are in conflict herewith, this Ordinance shall control to the extent of the conflicting provisions.

<u>Section 6.</u> <u>Severability.</u> The provisions of this Ordinance are intended to be severable. If any provision of this Ordinance is determined to be void or is declared illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 7. Codification. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be made a part of the

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Code of Ordinances of the City of Port St. Lucie, Florida. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such intention; the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section" or other appropriate word as may be necessary.

<u>Section 8.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after final adoption on second reading.
