SUBJECT: 2022 Legislative Session – Week 2 (January 17-21)

Following Martin Luther King Jr. Day, legislators picked up where they left off and began to tackle their second week of session. Issues affecting local businesses, emergency funds, public records and parent's rights moved through committees. With 12 days passed (and 48 days left) in session, the temperature is rising as the Governor and legislators seek to accomplish their policy and budget goals before facing reelection in November. These and other topics are covered in our summary of the week in Tallahassee.

City Activities

All of our House appropriations have been filed (listed below) and are moving through the committee process. Our Senate appropriations have been submitted to Senator Harrell and her team.

HB 2053 – City of Port St. Lucie Tradition Regional Park – \$500,000 – Approved by Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Agenda on January 19 – Eligible for House

HB 2389 – Port St. Lucie River/C-23 Water Quality Restoration Project Area 7A Design – \$416,875 – Approved by Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Committee – Eligible for House Budget

HB 2391 – Port St. Lucie Southern Grove Jobs Corridor Water Main Project - \$1,774,150 – Approved by Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Committee – Eligible for House Budget

Notable Topics

Senate Reapportionment Maps

Over last weekend, Governor DeSantis proposed his own congressional redistricting map that would likely hand Republicans 18 seats while Democrats receive 10. However, the Senate rejected his plans and approved SB 8060 with a 31-4 vote. This congressional map is estimated to set aside 16 Republican seats and 11 for Democrats with a good chance for them to gain an extra seat. Debates over SB 8060 include changes to districts in Tampa Bay, splitting the city and shifting Rep. Castor's district across Pinellas County. Governor DeSantis' office criticized the 5th Congressional district (spans from Tallahassee to Jacksonville) as "unconstitutional gerrymander." The Florida House has yet to pass its own congressional map. The final map will still have to be reviewed by DeSantis where he will have the last decision on what will happen.

Dollar, Dollar Bills

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On Friday, the Revenue Estimating Conference, which sets revenue expectations for state budget writers, said sales tax collections are \$2.2 billion above forecasts set in August, with an expectation that the next few months will “add to the overage.” Lawmakers were already awash in cash as the state's pandemic recovery bounces back, and Florida expects more than \$3 billion from the pandemic stimulus relief bill championed by Joe Biden in early 2021.

There was some disagreement about how the out years, or year beyond the current fiscal year, of the revenue forecast were handled, with Amy Baker, the Legislature's top economist, worried about the new numbers including one-time federal pandemic aid that has flowed to the state since March 2020.

The state, she said, has received between \$230 billion and \$250 billion in federal pandemic cash that has heated up spending in Florida, but roughly 95 percent of that money has already arrived. Baker was concerned that estimates from Holger Ciupalo, the governor's office economists on the panel, were too rosy because the federal money was set to dry up.

Abortion Bill

House Bill 5 by Rep. Grall, includes a 15 week ban on abortion and adds measures to include pregnant women into a tobacco education program, create an infant mortality review process, increase infant mortality reduction initiatives and include instances of human trafficking to the reporting requirements. In its first committee stop, this bill received opposition from Democratic Representatives including Rep. Eskamani who filed an amendment that would strike the abortion section while maintaining the other parts of the bill. Republicans overtook the vote and failed to pass the amendment. Representative Borrero, a supporter, argued that science has proven babies are more developed than previously thought and denying the right of life and full protection of babies who can feel pain is unthinkable. Public testimony got heated hearing from both proponents and opponents. The bill was reported favorably with 12 yeas and 6 nays. The next stops include Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee and Health & Human Services Committee.

Emergency Fund Cut in Half

After receiving input from Republicans and Democrats during its first committee stop, Sen. Burgess filed an amendment to SB 96, reducing the original \$1 billion emergency fund down to \$500 million. The Senate passed this bill with a 31-4 vote gaining the support of Senators Book, Bracy, Gibson, Pizzo and Brandes. Some House Democrats are still against the fund, because it fails to set limits on what an emergency is and how the money is to be spent. During the legislation's first hearing in the House (Pandemics & Public Emergencies Committee), Representative Caruso disagreed with the concerns stating this bill allows the Governor to constitute an emergency as he sees fit.

Business Estimates and Lawsuits Concern Local Government

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Two bills that have caught the attention of all in the “process” are SB 280 and 620. Both would place local government ordinances under the microscope if they negatively affected a business’ profits. With local governments across the state weighing in with their opposition, Senator Hutson filed an amendment to SB 280 during its final committee stop (Rules) that addresses some of the concerns. The amendment maintains the requirement of counties and municipalities to provide a business impact estimate before passing any local ordinances and adds exemptions to this requirement for ordinances such as comp plans and zoning. Further, the amendment makes clear that government can outsource the business estimation to outside groups. The bill passed by a vote of 14-2. SB 620, a companion bill, cleared its last committee (Appropriations). It allows businesses to sue local governments if local ordinances cause up to a 15% loss of their profits. Both will be heard in front of the full Senate.

Parents’ Rights

The House Education and Employment Committee advanced two bills concentrating on school policies. House Bill 1467 would eliminate school board members’ pay. Representative Garrison expressed his desire to get politics out of school board services and increase involvement of parents. House Bill 1557 ensures that schools will not make decisions about a students’ mental, emotional, physical health or well-being without involving parents. This bill received criticism from House Democrats and the LGBTQ community, stating that prohibiting discussions of gender identity and sexual orientation in elementary school would negatively affect children.

Public Records

Over 50 bills have been filed that deal with adding new exemptions to the state’s public records laws. The public has urged for more transparency and access to elected officials and government. Twenty of these bills have passed through their first committees. One would conceal the names of presidential applicants at state universities until the finalists are selected.
