#7. MILLER / CASE NO. 23-10241 / 6214 NW DIANA CT

Code Compliance Specialist Brandon Miller read the Case Presentation and Staff's recommendations into the record. He presented photos - of the subject property, broken fencing, sections missing from the fence, and property posting - taken at time of the inspections.

The Deputy City Clerk swore in Respondent Jeffrey M. Grear, who explained his father is the homeowner and has dementia. Respondent Grear stated he lives in New Jersey and will be traveling to Florida in February, and requested more time to get the fence repaired.

Code Compliance Specialist Miller indicated the City did not object to giving the Respondent an extension of 60 days, as the fence will require a permit. Respondent Grear was advised to call the Building Department regarding the permit. Special Magistrate Pelletier allowed 60 days for the Respondent to come into compliance.

#1. CERAMI / CASE NO. 23-17267 / 4202 SW SAVONA BLVD

Code Compliance Specialist Charles Cerami read the Case Presentation and Staff's recommendations into the record. He presented photos - of the subject property, missing panels and slats from the fence, and property posting - taken at the time of the inspections.

The Deputy City Clerk swore in Respondent Soline Clairvoyant, who explained she was not aware of the situation until she received the certified letter. Respondent Clairvoyant asked for an extension of 90 days to repair the fence.

Code Compliance Specialist Cerami stated the City did not object to an extension. Special Magistrate Pelletier allowed 90 days from today for the Respondent to come into compliance.

#5. GOMEZ / CASE NO. 23-17910 / 2981 SW SAVONA BLVD

Code Compliance Specialist Roque Gomez read the Case Presentation and Staff's recommendations into the record. He presented photos - of the subject property, high grass and weeds, open storage, and door hanger notice - taken at the time of the inspections. Code Compliance Specialist Gomez indicated that Staff also recommended enrolling the Respondent into the Christ Fellowship program to assist with any hardships. Code Compliance Specialist Gomez stated the City would approve any extension granted by the Special Magistrate.

The Deputy City Clerk swore in Respondent Michael Procko, who explained most of the open storage has been removed, except for the ladder and box. He explained he works in Vero Beach and then travels to Jensen Beach to visit with his mother who has dementia. Respondent Procko stated he was willing to accept assistance from Christ Fellowship and asked for an extension of 30 days.

Special Magistrate Pelletier allowed 30 days for the Respondent to come into compliance.

#8. MILLER / CASE NO. 23-17350 / 6024 NW FAVIAN AVE

Code Compliance Specialist Brandon Miller read the Case Presentation and Staff's recommendations into the record. He presented photos - of the subject property and a tarp on the roof of the home - taken at the time of the inspections.

The Deputy City Clerk swore in Respondent Julio Hernandez, who stated Marluh Izaguirree is his wife and they live in Chicago, IL. Respondent Hernandez explained they travel to Florida once a month and a storm damaged the roof a long time ago. He stated they submitted a claim with their insurance who put a tarp on the roof. Respondent Hernandez indicated the process is taking longer than expected, but the tarp has been replaced and the permit has been applied for. He stated 30 days would be enough time, as the roof has been paid for and the materials have been delivered.

Code Compliance Specialist Miller stated the City was not opposed to any extension. Special Magistrate Pelletier allowed 30 days for the Respondent to come into compliance.

#10. CAPP/BIEHL / CASE NO. 23-15333 / 148 NE SAGAMORE TER

On behalf of Code Compliance Specialist Capp, Code Compliance Supervisor Aaron Biehl read the Case Presentation and Staff's recommendations into the record. He presented photos - of the subject property, high grass and weeds, and property posting - taken at the time of the inspections. Code Compliance Supervisor Biehl noted the resident may have passed away.

Special Magistrate Pelletier ordered the Respondent to comply with the provisions of the City of Port St. Lucie Code by 2/14/2024. She stated, if the Respondent is not in compliance by this date, they will be required to pay a fine in the amount of \$25.00/day, not to exceed \$2,500. In addition, the amount of \$411.00 of the City's cost for investigating this matter will also be due. Special Magistrate Pelletier indicated, under section 162.08(5) Florida Statutes, the City is authorized to enter the property to take whatever steps are necessary to bring the property into compliance.

#12. HERZOG / CASE NO. 23-17693 / 1101 SE MENORES AVE

Code Compliance Specialist Tyler Herzog read the Case Presentation and Staff's recommendations into the record. He presented photos - of the subject property, high grass and weeds, and property posting - taken at the time of the inspections.

Special Magistrate Pelletier ordered the Respondent to comply with the provisions of the City of Port St. Lucie Code by 2/14/2024. She stated, if the Respondent is not in compliance by this date, they will be required to pay a fine in the amount of \$25.00/day for each day the violation continues, not to exceed \$2,500. In addition, the amount of \$411.00 of the City's cost for investigating this matter will also be due. Special Magistrate Pelletier indicated, under section 162.08(5) Florida Statutes, the City is authorized to enter the property to take whatever steps are necessary to bring the property into compliance.

11. Modification Requests Cases

11.a Hear Modification Requests Cases and Approve the Staff Recommendation

(Clerk's Note: This item was heard prior to the Code Violation Cases.)

Evelyn Rojas, Lien Services Department, stated these modifications are requested by the applicant. They are heard as a matter of City policy and are not mandated by Florida Statute. City Council holds these liens, which are considered assets of the City. Per City ordinance, the Special Magistrate has authority to modify these liens. She indicated agenda items #20 through #33 have been agreed upon prior to this hearing and require an order to be signed by the Special Magistrate.

ARMSTRONG / CASE NO. CE-23-12598 / 470 SW TULIP BLVD

Code Compliance Manager Wesley Armstrong presented photos - of the subject property, debris on the vacant lot, pile of debris relocated near a tree, posting of violation hearing, and removal of the debris - taken at the time of the inspections. He explained Staff heard from the applicant on September 27, 2023, when the applicant indicated a dumpster would be placed on the property in two days, but that did not occur. Code Compliance Manager Armstrong stated the applicant did not attend the Violation Hearing on October 4, 2023, or the Certification of Fines hearing on November 8, 2023, when the pile of debris remained. He indicated that upon follow-up inspection on November 29, 2023, the pile was removed and the case was closed. Compliance Manager Armstrong stated, at that time, the property was in violation and incurred \$1,225.00 in fines, along with \$411.00 in hard costs, totaling \$1,636.00. He noted the City has found no hardship in this case.

The Deputy City Clerk swore in Respondent Zamel Abou, owner of Torching Holding and Monna Homes, who stated his company builds hundreds of homes in Port St. Lucie and this is his first time at City Hall for this type of matter. He explained the debris was illegally dumped on his lot, and he was in communication with the Code Compliance Officer when he returned from being out of town.

Ms. Rojas indicated the Respondent has paid an application fee of \$350.00 for the modification and proposed to pay \$100.00 towards the lien. She noted the \$350.00 application fee is nonrefundable and is not applied towards any reduction. Respondent Abou stated he spent \$450.00 for the dumpster, \$350.00 for the application, and offered \$100.00, but will offer another \$100.00 or \$200.00.

Code Compliance Manager Armstrong explained, based on Chapter 37 of the modification process, there is no hardship present and the Respondent had ample time to remove the debris or attend the hearings. Respondent Abou indicated he was out of town and when he returned, he was in communication with the Code Compliance Officer regarding the dumpster. He stated Staff told him this was the appeal process, which is why he is here today.

Deputy City Attorney Scott explained today's hearing is for the Respondent to explain his hardship as to why he cannot pay the full amount due and to propose or offer a different amount. He stated it is up to the Special Magistrate to modify the fine that has been certified.

Respondent Abou indicated that his hardship is that the debris is not his garbage and reiterated the amount of money he has spent to have it removed. Code Compliance Manager Armstrong stated that no hardship has been presented, so the City is asking for the full amount of \$1,636.00. Special Magistrate Pelletier stated the amount stands, to which the Respondent stated it was not fair. Ms. Rojas noted Respondent Abou will have 30, 60, or 90 days to pay the fine amount. Code Compliance Manager Armstrong stated the City was comfortable with the 90-day window for payment, to which the Respondent stated it was not about the money.

the bulletin board in the lobby of Port St. Lucie City Hall. Also, a Notice of Hearing was posted on the property in question, along with an Affidavit of Posting, which included a copy of the notice posted and the date and places of its posting. If the certification card was not returned to the Neighborhood Services Department within ten days before the Hearing, posting was completed in the same manner as if the card was returned unclaimed as stated above. Any photos shown at today's hearing are kept and maintained as public records of the City of Port St. Lucie's Neighborhood Services Department.

The Special Magistrate has the jurisdiction and authority to hear and decide alleged violations and exercise the powers of a Code Enforcement Board as provided in chapter 162, Florida Statutes.
